

Refuse/Sewer Rate Increase

Beginning with the current quarter's bill, refuse rates will increase by \$1.00 from \$52.00 to \$53.00 per dwelling unit. Residential sewer rates will increase by \$33.00 from \$159.00 to \$192.00 per dwelling unit. Commercial sewer rates will also increase by \$33.00 from \$200.00 to \$233.00 per EDU (equivalent dwelling unit).

If you are a residential customer with refuse service only, your quarterly bill is now \$53.00. If you have both refuse and sewer service, your quarterly bill is now \$245.00.

For customers who use a Bill Pay service through their bank, or customers who use the Township's Automatic Withdrawal Program, you should make sure you update your records to reflect the new rates.

Reporting Street Light Outages

The Township receives many calls from residents to report that a street light is burned out. Street lights are installed and maintained by the electric company in your area. All outages should be reported directly to them.

If you are a PPL customer, call 1-800-342-5775, press 1, then press 4.

If you are a MetEd customer, call 1-888-544-4877. Be prepared to give a street address where the light is located. It is also helpful to them if you can provide the pole number which is posted on each street light.

Township Notification System

During the recent harsh winter season, Fairview Township implemented the use of its new electronic notification system to alert residents of several snow emergencies. This system not only allows the Township to reach out to residents during emergencies, but can be useful for other time-sensitive alerts such as street closures, trash collection delays, etc. Many of you may already be enrolled in the notification system if you have a published number. If you are not enrolled and would like to do so, please sign up on the Township's website, www.twp.fairview.pa.us, by selecting the Emergency Telephone Notification System tab. You can choose to be notified by land line, cell phone, text and/or email.

Act 209 Traffic Impact Study

Fairview Township, along with many municipalities, has experienced its fair share of growth over the past decade. This of course is due to new development and re-development of properties within the Township. To plan for this continued development in the future, Fairview Township has recently updated its Township Comprehensive Plan (completed in 2010 and establishes the groundwork of how the township will be developed in the future); completed a re-write of our Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map (completed in early 2013 and establishes the parameters of how properties can be utilized as they are developed); and now, the third leg of this process, has established an Act 209 - Traffic Impact Study Committee.

This Committee is comprised of Township residents and business owners, Township staff and an engineering consultant. The committee will be responsible for evaluating the existing traffic concerns and more importantly concentrating on how future development will affect the Township's roadway system. This study will require compiling of information, numerous meetings and direction from the committee throughout the process. Once the Act 209 study is completed, the Township will be able to assess specific monetary fees to developers for any traffic impacts associated with their proposed projects. Fairview Township will then have these fees available to make necessary improvements to the affected roadways.

The Act 209 Traffic Impact Study Committee expects to have its findings completed and forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for their action by the summer of 2015.

CURBSIDE PICKUP~YARD WASTE COLLECTION DATES FOR 2014

GRASS CLIPPINGS are ***NOT*** part of yard waste collection. You may use your grass clippings as mulch in your gardens and flower beds OR mow your grass using a mulching mower OR bag and dispose of grass clippings as part of your weekly trash collection.

Paint Disposal: Latex and oil-based paint can be disposed of in your regular household trash. Simply add shredded paper, sand or kitty litter in the can to absorb any liquid. Put lid back on can and place paint can into your household trash bag.

Gasonline/Kerosene Disposal: Check with your local auto garages as well as Pep Boys, AutoZone, Advanced Auto Parts, Target, Wal-Mart, Etc.

Rechargeable Battery Disposal: *(Regular alkaline batteries are to be thrown into your household trash).* Rechargeable batteries such as Nickel Cadmium (NiCd), Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) or Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) should be recycled at the following locations:
