 - 1.) Building and Zoning Permit applications

 - 3.) All ordinances that have been adopted by the Township?
- Grass is permitted to grow to a maximum of 8 inches in height in residential districts before a violation occurs?
- A permit is required for re-roofing of a home, adding a residential accessory structure over 400 sq. ft., adding a deck higher than 30 inches or more above grade, or changing/upgrading your electrical service?
- Fairview Township has adopted ordinances that require storm water infiltration of all new impervious areas over 400 sq. ft.?
- Mapping associated with FEMA's Floodplains was updated in Fairview Township in December 2015?

Refuse Holiday Schedule/Delays

Thanksgiving Day is the only holiday that will affect your regularly scheduled collection day. Note: Thursday, Nov. 24 will be collected Friday, Nov. 25 and Friday's route will be collected Saturday, Nov. 26. There are NO schedule changes for the weeks of Christmas & New Year's.



2016 Leaf Collection

Leaf collection will begin the week of October 24th. The last collection day will be Friday, December 2nd.

- ▶ Leaves will be collected the day after your trash collection day, beginning as early as 6:00 a.m. If your trash day is Friday, leaves will be collected Monday.
- ▶ Our goal is to collect leaves once a week in your neighborhood, however weather, holidays and volume of leaves may affect this schedule.
- ▶ Rake leaves close to the curb or edge of the road without blocking the roadway or storm drains.
- ▶ Do not mix grass or brush with leaves.
- ▶ Leaves in bags or trash cans will not be collected.



SNOW SEASON APPROACHING SOON



Here are a few reminders:

Plows & Driveways:

Plows travel down the right side of the roadway, the same direction as normal traffic flow.

There is no way to avoid plows putting snow at the end of driveways.

To minimize the amount of snow placed by a plow, put shoveled snow on the right side of the driveway as you look from your driveway into the street.

This project is our way of giving back to the community that supports us throughout the year. Everyone in our Fairview Township Family hopes that all of you have a very



The Township receives many calls from residents to report that a street light is burned out. Street lights are installed and maintained by the electric company in your area. All outages should be reported directly to them.

If you are a PPL customer, call 1-800-342-5775, press 1, then press 4. If you are a MetEd customer, call 1-800-544-4877.

Be prepared to give a street address where the light is located. It is also helpful to them if you can provide the pole number which is posted on each street light.

FIRE PREVENTION

The Fairview Township Fire Department has changed direction with our approach towards educating both our adults and children throughout the community. We are now using a pro-active teaching methodology rather than the re-active ways of the years past throughout the fire service.

We now have firefighters teaming up with the teachers and delivering a ten week focused program in our elementary school grades, which evolves around the science of fire and how to prevent the fire from happening in the first place.

We have become very community active. With the acquisition of a well designed high technology fire safety trailer, we have been busy with many community events. In our three years of operation of the trailer, we have been able to provide a quality hands on prevention education including kitchen fire safety, proper procedures for using 911, pre-planning and practicing escape plans for every home. Everyone has the opportunity of practicing exit drills in a live smoke environment.

With our activities in the schools and the community, we have had over 2000 children and adults go through the program over the past three years. The response from the parents and teachers has been very positive and encouraging.

We are volunteers giving back to our community. You may need our services someday; however, we need you now! If you are a retired teacher, youth group leader or scout leader and enjoy working and teaching our children, we would greatly appreciate you contacting us so that we may continue with our efforts in educating and protecting our community.

FAIRVIEW TOWNSHIP POLICE MAGNET

The Fairview Township Police Department would like to thank the many residents who expressed their support and appreciation for this agency after the attacks and murders of police officers in various parts of the country.

To help support the families of those officers killed, the police department is selling magnets with our department name and motto "Dedicated to Service".

The center of the magnet is removable and contains the department patch. All proceeds will go to Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.).

C.O.P.S. is a non-profit organization that provides assistance to family members of officers who died in the line of duty. They offer scholarships for children, counseling reimbursement, support through criminal trials, and various camps and retreats to help families deal with their loss. SCAM ALERT

Most people think they are too smart to fall for one, but these con artists can be extremely persuasive and aggressive and ultimately manipulate people out of billions of dollars every year. These scams typically target either a person's fear or their greed.

One of the most common scams recently is someone calling you and claiming to be from the IRS. They will demand money for back taxes and threaten arrest if you don't pay. Sometimes they will even make the number appear as if it is coming from the police station or other government facility. Please know that the IRS will never make this notification by telephone.

Another common scam is receiving notification by email, through social media, or a phone call claiming your grandson or other relative is in jail and needs money. You might also receive an email or letter stating you won a lottery or contest, but you must first pay the taxes on that money. Or perhaps some rich Saudi Prince randomly selected you to receive millions of dollars, but he needs you to send him money as a gesture of trust.

There are several other schemes out there, but the rule of thumb is if it is too good to be true, it probably is. You should never send these people any money or give them your credit card or banking information. If you are unsure on what to do, please contact the police.

Home Delivered Meals

The "Home Delivered Meals Program" is designed to provide a well-balanced daily meal to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and have no means for assuring healthful nutrition. On Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, a hot meal is delivered to the older adult's home. Tuesday and Thursday meals are a cold bagged lunch delivered with the previous day's hot meal. Volunteers from the local senior center deliver the meals to the older adult's home.
