**MINUTES**

**I. CALL TO ORDER:**

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Larry Cox, at 7:00 p.m.

**IV. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSIONS:**

There was no executive session since the last meeting.

**V. RECOGNITION OF PUBLIC**

1. Mr. Barry Kindt of 881 Pinetown Rd. and several neighboring residents requested a four-way stop sign be installed at the intersection of Pinetown Road and Moores Mt. Road for the safety of the residents and motorists due to past accidents and excessive speeding.

Mr. Waller, Codes Director stated that this is a state road intersection and the Board of Supervisors could request that Mr. Bitner, Township Engineer contact PennDot and provide them with an accident history report and information on the growth in this area and recommend the installation of a four-way stop sign at this intersection.

Chief Loper offered to assist in providing an accident history report.

2. Jeff Pheasant, 819 Pinetown Road, reiterated the concern of the number of motorists exceeding the speed limit traveling along Pinetown Road through the intersection at Moores Mt. Road.
3. Don Hardenstein, 730 Moores Mt. Road, stated he witnessed a number of accidents in the area of Siddonsburg and Moores Mt. Road within the past 60 days and was pleased with the communication and efforts Chief Loper has put forth to take action to reduce these occurrences.

**VI. AGENDA ITEMS**

1. Keith Chase (Representative of the Airport Authority) thanked the Board of Supervisors for the opportunity to serve Fairview Township. Mr. Chase stated that the Capital City Airport recently completed projects such as building a separator fence between the Mt. Olivet Cemetery and project runway safety area, an oil water separator project, and the "Capital City Master Plan". Mr. Chase announced that Community Day, held on June 17<sup>th</sup>, with over 1,000 attendees was a success. Mr. Chase also noted that the airport usage is up 32% from July 2016 to July 2017.

Mr. Pirritano commended Mr. Chase on a job well done and informed the public of the upcoming Fly-In/Drive-In event benefiting the Make-A-Wish Foundation. This event will be held on September 16, 2017 from 10:30 am to 2:00 pm at the Capital City Airport featuring a theme called "Planes, Trains, and Automobiles".



**7. Schedule Budget Meeting:**

Mr. Jones made a motion, seconded by Mr. Allen to advertise and schedule a budget meeting for Wednesday September 27, 2017 at 6pm.

Vote on the motion: All yes. The motion carried.

**8. West Shore Recreation Commission 2018 Budget:**

Mr. Pirritano made a motion, seconded by Mr. Allen to approve the West Shore Recreation 2018 budget, as presented, with no increase in Fairview Township's per capita contribution rate of \$2.50, for a total 2018 contribution of \$41,670.00.

Vote on the motion: All yes. The motion carried.

**9. Police Station:**

Mr. Allen made a motion, seconded by Mr. Jones to approve the extension of the current Fairview Township Police Station lease for two months at \$7,505.00 per month.

Vote on the motion: All yes. The motion carried.

**VII. OLD BUSINESS**

1. Dr. Cox and Mr. Pirritano stated that National Night Out was once again a great success. Mr. Pirritano recognized Keith Reynolds, Highway Foreman for going above and beyond the call of duty in assisting in that event. Chief Loper also stated his gratitude for Mr. Reynold's stand out performance and assistance to make sure this year's National Night Out was a success. Chief Loper also thanked all other volunteers for their time and hard work in making it a great night for the community. Chief Loper estimated 3,000 to 3,500 attended the event.

2. Attorney Dave Jones stated that the Traffic Improvement Agreement with regard to the Fairview Crossroads Development was received and the Board can move forward with the HOP Traffic Signal Applications that were tabled from June's Board of Supervisors Meeting. Mr. Charlie Courtney from McNees Wallace updated the Board on the status of these applications and asked that the Board authorize staff to submit these applications.

Mr. Jones made a motion, seconded by Mr. Allen to submit (2) two HOP authorization forms and (3) Traffic Signal Application authorization forms to PennDot for Yorktown, Wyndamere, and Salem Roads Including Resolutions 2017-8, 2017-9, and 2017-10.

Vote on the motion: All yes. The motion carried.

3. Chief Loper commended all of the Township's Officers for their outstanding work and stated that he had received two recent positive comments from residents for Officer Anthony Jackson for his outstanding work.

**VIII. NEW BUSINESS**

1. Dr. Cox stated he received an application for donations to assist in the "Redland Renovation Project" for the Redland High School's weight room.

Mr. Allen made a motion, seconded by Mr. Pirritano to approve a \$500.00 donation to the Redland Weight Room Project.

Vote on the motion: All yes. The motion carried.

2. Attorney Dave Jones stated there was a release of \$50,000.00 of escrow from the sale of the sewer system.
