## MINUTES

### I. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Larry Cox, at 7:00 p.m.

### IV. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSIONS:

There was no executive session since the last meeting.

### V. RECOGNITION OF PUBLIC

1. Mr. Pirritano introduced Cameron Gould, a boy scout from troop 82, currently working on his citizen in the community badge.
2. Susanne Zinn, 681 Pleasant View Road voiced concerns about the amount of ducks and geese located at a neighboring resident's home along Pleasant View Road.

Mr. Waller stated the current ordinance restricts the number of poultry however, the "use" was established under old ruling, therefore is grandfathered in but he is currently seeking help from the SPCA.

Mary Oneil, 683 Pleasant View Road questioned the board if the waste produced by such a large number of animals will be addressed to have it removed to help decrease odor? Ms. Oniel also complained of the loud music at the same residence.

Mr. Waller stated the codes department will follow up on the waste and odor issue.

Chief Loper stated he will look into the noise level coming from the residence and follow up with the SPCA to have them check on the welfare of the animals currently being cared for by the resident.

3. Joseph Bartley, 837 Old Forge Road stated that he connected to water and sewer by the required dates noted in PA American Waters notifications however, is upset that some of the neighbors have exceeded the deadline therefore not getting billed and/or paying for service. Mr. Bartley would like to know who will be enforcing this issue.

Mr. Waller explained that the Township is actively working with the water company on the water and sewer connections process.

4. Henry Hedden, from the Red Land Community Library thanked the Board and police department for their continued support and stated the Library will officially move to the new location in Newberry Commons where the Senior Center used to be by June 1<sup>st</sup>. They plan to start a summer reading program for kids upon opening.

5. Mike Travitz, 246 Willis Road addressed the board with regard to the upcoming plans to tar and chip Willis Road.

Mr. Bitner stated that the tar and chipping to Willis Road requires two (2) applications and will be completed in one (1) day, completing one (1) side at a time to allow through traffic. Residents will be given a minimum of five (5) days' notice prior to the beginning of the work.

Mr. Travitz stated he did not agree with the Township on this method of paving for this road.

Mr. Leslie informed Mr. Travitz that the township will continue with the current plan to tar and chip Willis Road and monitor the condition of the road for the need of paving in the future.

Mr. Bourque stated the organization is in their second year of the grant program. June 2018 is the 20<sup>th</sup> year anniversary for their "Made in America" tour event. In celebration of the 20<sup>th</sup> year anniversary local factories will be opening their doors for touring.

4. **Resolution No. 2018-3 – Temporary Banner, New Cumberland Apple Festival:**

Mr. Pirritano made a motion, seconded by Mr. Leslie to adopt Resolution 2018-3 for the installation of a temporary banner on the Iron Bridge for the New Cumberland Apple Festival from 08/20/18 to 10/01/18 and forward same to PennDOT for approval.

5. **Authorization to Hire Public Works Laborer**

Mr. Pirritano made a motion, seconded by Mr. Leslie to authorize advertisement for a laborer position in the Public Works Department.

6. **Municipal Service Agreement for Traffic Control Signals**

Mr. Pirritano made a motion, seconded by Mr. Leslie to approve the Municipal Service Agreement for Traffic Control Signals between Fairview Township and Percs, Inc. for a (1) one year term effective today, April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

7. **Mobile Data Computer Service Agreement – York County 911 Communications**

Mr. Leslie made a motion, seconded by Mr. Pirritano to approve the Mobile Data Computer Service Agreement between Fairview Township Police Department and York County 911- Communications effective April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2023.
