## 2025 LEAF COLLECTION

**LEAF COLLECTION WILL BEGIN THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 27TH.  
THE LAST COLLECTION DAY WILL BE FRIDAY, DECEMBER 5TH.**

**PLEASE NOTE: LEAVES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP ACCORDING TO A SPECIFIC SCHEDULE BECAUSE OF UNKNOWN FACTORS SUCH AS VOLUME OF LEAVES AND UNCERTAINTY OF WEATHER CONDITIONS. THE HIGHWAY CREW WILL BE OUT COLLECTING LEAVES EVERY DAY ALL DAY THROUGHOUT THE LEAF COLLECTION PERIOD.**

- 1. Rake leaves no more than 6 ft. from the curb or edge of the road without blocking the roadway or storm drains. (The leaf vacuum cannot reach more than 6 ft.)**
- 2. Do not mix grass or brush with leaves.**
- 3. Leaves in bags or trashcans will not be collected.**
- 4. The leaf vacuum and truck are too large to collect leaves between parked cars or near parked cars. Please allow at least eight feet of open space.**

## WINTER HOURS

Beginning Friday, November 1st, the recycling center will begin winter hours as follows:

Monday through Friday  
9:00 A.M. TO NOON (except holidays) and will be open the same time on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday each month.

## DIRECTIONS

From I-83, take exit 39A, turn left onto Lewisberry Road. In approximately 2 miles, turn right onto Spanglers Mill Road. The facility will be on your left.

## RESIDENTS ONLY

Both the Yard Waste and the Electronics Recycle Center are for residential use only, **NO CONTRACTORS/BUSINESSES PERMITTED**. If a contractor can provide proof that he/she is currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident, they will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.

## MULCH & LEAF COMPOST

Leaf compost and woodchips will be free to residents during the hours listed above while supplies last. You must present a driver's license or other form of I.D. for proof of residency. It will be your responsibility to load the material.

## DISPOSAL AT FACILITY

- You must be a Township resident with residential refuse service.
- Township employees do not load or unload material(s).
- You must present a valid driver's license or other valid ID with your name and address.
- A Township employee will tell you if your yard waste is acceptable and may be unloaded.
- No dumping of yard waste permitted when the facility is closed.

## ITEMS ACCEPTED

Brush up to 4' in length  
Christmas trees (Tinsel & ornaments removed)  
Tree limbs 6" diameter, 40 lbs.  
Plants and flowers  
Shrubbery and pruning's

## ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

Bricks, Concrete, Construction Debris, Food Waste, Grass Clippings, Limbs over 6" in diameter, Soil or Sod, Stone, Tree Stumps.

Tree limbs from 6" to 10" in diameter and cut in 6' lengths will be accepted.

Observed holidays are noted in **RED**. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

## BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (on scheduled dates) must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than six (6) trash bags or containers will be collected per collection.
- Mobile Carts count as a total of three (3) bags or containers.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.



Always keep a copy of the tax bill for your records.

There is a labeled TAX DROP BOX outside the office for payments. Please do not put cash in this box! Any unpaid bills will be turned over for collection on Dec. 31st! The Tax Office being closed is NO EXCUSE to not pay your taxes!

## Commute with rabbittransit!

rabbitWORKS, helps employers and individuals form a vanpool with 5–15 coworkers or neighbors who live near one another. Enterprise provides a recent-model SUV or van, and riders can choose to rotate driving responsibilities.


Participants pay only \$40/month for the first five months. Starting in month six, the fare increases to \$80/month, with the remaining cost subsidized by rabbittransit. The monthly fee includes insurance, maintenance, and 24/7 roadside assistance.

Vanpooling isn't just practical – it pays off. Participants can save up to \$10,000 per year due to reduced fuel, toll, and vehicle maintenance costs. When you commute solo, all those miles, gas receipts, and repair bills add up quickly. With vanpooling, it adds up differently: more savings, less wear and tear, fewer stressful drives, and more time to relax or connect with coworkers.

# Rent-a-Kid

**YORK COUNTY OFFICE OF AGING**



This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist older adults in completing routine light-duty household chores and yard work such as mowing lawns, raking leaves, holiday decorating, dog walking, shoveling snow and much more. The goal of the Rent-A-Kid program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.

Adults age 60 and older in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for youth in their area. It is the responsibility of the older adult to contact the youth and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is at least minimum wage. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the older adult to pay, the youth may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

Rent-A-Kids' are geographically matched with older adults. The older adult and youth are required to screen each other. The youth's parents are encouraged to be involved, especially at the start of the discussion. Many matches continue for several years beginning while the youth is still in middle school and continuing through high school.

# Stormwater Management

**YOUR STORM DRAIN IS JUST FOR RAIN!!**

As you clean up your lawn this fall, please do not rake leaves or other debris into storm drains. Only untainted rainwater should flow from your yard into storm drains. Lawn clippings, leaves and other debris often clump, contributing to a larger problem underground in the pipe system.

Even if you only “occasionally” allow grass clippings, leaves and other plants to wash down the drains... Multiply your “occasional” by the hundreds of subdivisions and thousands of homes in South Central PA region, and it is easy to see why non-point source pollution is becoming a major concern.

The best option, ecologically speaking, is to re-mow your yard several times so the clippings will sink down into the lawn and break down quickly, providing valuable fertilizer.

## *On-Lot Septic Management*

As part of Fairview Township’s Act 537 Plan as approved by PA DEP, Chapter 18, Part 6 requires that on-lot septic systems must be pumped at least once every four (4) years. The Township is divided into four (4) septic zones, with Zone 3 due for pumping in 2026. To find out what zone you are located in, please visit the Fairview Township website and locate the Septic Zone map.

As a property owner, you are required to:

- Have your system pumped and inspected by a certified pumping hauler.
- Submit the Septic System Report (Manifest Report) to the Township within 30 days of the pumping.

You can view the full on-lot septic ordinance online at [www.twp.fairview.pa.us](http://www.twp.fairview.pa.us). Again, if your property is within Zone 3 and your system has been pumped within 4 years, please disregard any correspondence you may receive, as long as the township was copied with your pumping manifest. ## BUILDING & ZONING PERMIT INFORMATION REVIEWS & INSPECTIONS

Fairview Township now has an in-house building inspector and no longer utilizing a 3<sup>rd</sup> party agency for reviews and inspections.

Please note:

- Residential building permit reviews can take approx. fifteen (15) business days
- Commercial building permit reviews can take approx. thirty (30) business days
- Zoning permit reviews can take approx. seven (7) business days

## A FEW FALL MAINTENANCE REMINDERS

### Get HVAC Inspected

Inspect home's outer walls, ceiling, windows, doors & floor

Change return filters in forced air heating systems

Inspect plumbing pipes to prevent bursting

### Get your roof checked out

Check or install weather stripping at doors, caulk around windows, add storm windows or window films when applicable

Seal up foundation and driveway cracks, because during cold weather moisture can seep into these areas and freeze causing surfaces to crack and split.

Change Smoke Detector Batteries

## PROJECTS THAT **DO** REQUIRE A BUILDING PERMIT

- New home
- A deck 30 inches or more above grade
- Additions to the home
- New/Repair/Upgrade of utilities – Electrical Plumbing Mechanical Sewage
- Swimming pool, including fences around the pool
- Retaining wall over 4' at any given point
- Replacement of bedroom egress windows (please call)
- Structural renovations to the home (interior and exterior)
- Replacement of roof shingle
- Alterations or certain repairs to the home (please call)
- Garages, sheds and other accessory structures over 400 sq. ft. in size

If you do not see your specific project, please contact the Codes Office at 717-901-5220.

## PROJECTS THAT **DO NOT** REQUIRE A BUILDING PERMIT

- \* Sheds, detached garages, accessory structures less than 400 sq. ft.
- Replacement of siding or windows and doors – same size and location
- \* Installing a fence unless pool barrier (zoning permit required)
- Installing a swimming pool with less than 24" in water depth
- Swing sets and other playground equipment
- Window awnings that do not project more than 54" from the exterior wall
- \* Installation of an uncovered deck less than 30" above grade
- \* = A Zoning permit will be required

## PROJECTS THAT **DO** REQUIRE A ZONING PERMIT

- New Home
- Additions to the home
- Installation of any accessory structure (shed, garage, pole building, green house)
- Swimming Pool
- Attached and detached garages
- Installing a fence (other than a small 24" or less garden fence)
- Installing awnings
- Installing a porch/patio/deck
- Any deck
- Retaining walls less than four (4) feet

## PROJECTS THAT **DO NOT** REQUIRE A ZONING PERMIT

(PLEASE NOTE: IT IS ALWAYS BEST TO CONFIRM THAT THE PROPOSED PLACEMENT WILL NOT BE WITHIN ANY EASEMENT OR OTHER UTILITY RIGHT-OF-WAY)

- Repair existing floorboards on a deck
- Replacing windows and doors with new of the same size
- Placement of swing set or other playground equipment
- Placement of trees, shrubbery, flowers or vegetable gardens
- Installing a 24" or less garden fence (CAN NOT be located within the Township right of way or impede sight distance)

## DO YOU NEED A BURN PERMIT?

No permit shall be required for any fire for which the sole purpose is to cook food, provided that said fire is confined in a fireproof container or fire pit or contained within a fireproof container used as an outside fireplace.

A SPECIAL BURN PERMIT **IS REQUIRED** FOR THE FOLLOWING: BONFIRES, AGRICULTURAL CLEANING OR LAND DEVELOPMENT.

## Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home

Most of the electronics we use in our homes every day are powered by lithium-ion batteries. In fact, most everything that's rechargeable uses this kind of battery.



Lithium-Ion Batteries store a lot of energy in a small place. These batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if overcharged or damaged. By learning how to **Buy, Charge, and Recycle** these batteries safely, you can help prevent a fire in your home.



**Buy** only listed products. When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.



**STOP** using your device right away if the battery smells weird, gets too hot, makes popping noises, changes in shape or color. If it is safe, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.



**Charge** devices safely. Always use the cables that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved.



**Recycle** batteries responsibly. Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire.



**Charge** your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.



**Recycle** your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit **call2recycle.org** to find a recycling spot near you.
