WINTER REMINDERS

PLOWS & DRIVEWAYS

Plows travel down the right side of the roadway, the same direction as normal traffic flow. There is no way to avoid plows pushing snow into the end of driveways. To minimize the amount of snow pushed by a plow into your driveway, place shoveled snow on the right side of the driveway as you look into the street. Residents clearing their driveways may want to wait until the plows have completed the street and have pushed the snow back to the curb.

Throwing snow back into the street after plowing is illegal and a violation of township ordinance.

All portable basketball hoops **MUST** be removed from streets; this is also a violation of township ordinance.

Observed holidays are noted in **RED**. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (on scheduled dates) must be curbside by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than six (6) trash bags or containers will be collected per collection.
- Mobile Carts count as a total of three (3) bags or containers.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curbside.

Effective January 1st, 2025 Penn Waste increased quarterly rates per home by \$3.78 per quarter due to an increase in disposal rates of \$4.00/ton at the York County Resource Recovery Facility also effective January 1st, 2025. The new Quarterly rate for Fairview Township will be \$79.35 per quarter.

PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WINTER WEATHER

HEATING

- Test all systems
- Clean any debris around unit
- Change filters
- Reverse ceiling fans
- Program thermostat to regulate temperatures

FIREPLACE

- Clean and check dampers
- Stock up on firewood
- Inspect your chimney cap
- Ensure you have a fire extinguisher nearby

INSULATION

- Look for drafts
- Apply caulk/weather stripping where needed
- Remove and store window AC units
- Seal off crawl space

PLUMBING

- Winterize sprinkler system
- Turn off outdoor spigots
- Detach and drain hose
- Insulate pipes and faucets
- Turn down your water heater

EXTERIOR

- Winterize and store lawn equipment, outdoor furniture, and grills
- Prepare ice melt, sand, snow shovels, and car scrapers
- Inspect roof for damage
- Clean out gutters

OTHER

- Test and replace batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors
- Bring plants and delicate trees indoors
- Replace old fire extinguishers



ON-LOT SEPTIC MANAGEMENT

Fairview Township's Act 537 Plan as approved by PA DEP, Chapter 18, Part 6 requires that on-lot septic systems must be pumped at least once every four (4) years. The Township is divided into four (4) septic zones, with Zone 2 due for pumping in 2025. To find out what zone you are located in, please visit the Fairview Township website and locate the Septic Zone map.



As a property owner, you are required to:

- Have your system pumped and inspected by a certified pumping hauler.
- Submit the Septic System Report (Manifest Report) to the Township within 30 days of the pumping.

You can view the full on-lot septic ordinance online at www.twp.fairview.pa.us.

Again, if your property is within Zone 2 and your system has been pumped within 4 years, please disregard any correspondence you may receive, as long as the Township was copied with your pumping manifest. MS-4 / STORMWATER MANAGEMENT INSPECTIONS DUE BY MARCH 15, 2025

Post Construction Stormwater Management Best Management Practices (PCSM BMPs) inspections are due to Fairview Township by March 15th. Attn: Homeowners, HOA's and/or Business/Property Owners - If you have a stormwater BMP on your property, you may be responsible for the ongoing inspection and maintenance of that facility. Examples of these include, but are not limited to: Detention/Retention Ponds, Infiltration Ponds, Infiltration Pits, Swales, Infiltration Berms, Stormwater Quality Inlets, and others. These facilities require proper operation and maintenance to ensure they are functioning properly. Inspection forms are available on the MS-4/Stormwater page of the Fairview Township website. These inspection forms are due by March 15th of each calendar year. WINTER REMINDERS

1. Prior to driving during winter weather, make sure that your vehicle is in good working condition.
2. If the Township has declared a snow emergency, please avoid driving if possible so you don't become part of the problem.
3. Emergency services are always inundated with calls for service during a snow emergency. Due to higher call volume, we cannot guarantee a quick response.
4. State roads are cleared by PENNDOT and not Fairview Township.

LAWS AND ORDINANCES

1. Residents should never push or blow snow from their driveway or sidewalks into the street.
2. When the Township declares a snow emergency, residents are not permitted to park on the street in neighborhoods where they may otherwise be permitted to park.
3. Motorists are not allowed to drive with snow and/or ice obstructing any window on their vehicle.
4. Any property owner who has sidewalks in front of or along their property must clear those sidewalks within 12 hours of the snow stopping. If the snow stops by 6:00 pm or after, residents have until 10:00 am the next morning.

Winter weather brings very unique challenges to emergency services and Township Road Crews. Some patience and common sense can go a long way toward avoiding any problems. We will all do our best to continue to provide the best service possible. We ask that you follow these guidelines and laws to avoid creating additional issues on the roads.



As winter approaches, we also want to remind residents to build an emergency supply kit for your car: first aid kit, jumper cables, full tank of gas, cell phone and cell phone charger, shovel, ice scraper, snowbrush, sand/cat litter, warm clothing & blanket, water and snacks, tire chains, towrope, and flares. Help for Seniors

Rent-A-Kid Program Sponsored by York County Area Agency

This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist older adults in completing routine light-duty household chores and yard work such as mowing lawns and shoveling snow. York County adults 60 years of age or older who need help with such household chores, can contact the York County Area Agency on Aging to hire a teenager in their area. Recommended pay rate is at least minimum wage. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the older adult to pay, the youth may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay. The teenagers must complete an application and have it signed by their parent and school guidance counselor. The teens are then entered into a regional database. When the older adults contact the agency, they are matched electronically with teenagers in their area.

(Neither adults or youth are screened by the York County Area Agency on Aging). The goal of this program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.

Do you or someone you know need transportation assistance getting to a medical appointment or other life sustaining service? Rabbittransit's shared ride service may be right for you. Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations during limited hours and in specific areas, including Fairview Township. All shared ride trips require a reservation. There is a required application and reservation process that must be completed before riding. 
