If a contractor can provide proof that he/she is currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident, they will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.



YARD WASTE GUIDELINES

DIRECTIONS: From I-83, take exit 39A, turn left onto Lewisberry Road, in approximately 2 miles turn right onto Spanglers Mill Road, facility will be on your left.

DISPOSAL AT FACILITY:

- You must be a township resident with residential refuse service
- Township employees do not load or unload material(s)
- You must present a valid driver's license or other valid ID with your name and address
- A township employee will tell you if your yard waste is acceptable and may be unloaded.
- No dumping of yard waste permitted when the facility is closed.

ITEMS ACCEPTED

Tree limbs 6" diameter, 40 lbs.
Brush up to 4' in length
Plants and flowers
Shrubbery and pruning's
Christmas trees
(Tinsel & ornaments removed)



ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

Soil or Sod
Grass Clippings
Limbs over 6" diameter
Tree stumps
Construction debris
Bricks, stone, concrete
Food Waste



PREPARATION FOR ITEMS ACCEPTED

Cut limbs/branches to 4-foot lengths. Place all acceptable yard waste in containers or bundle trimmings with rope, string or twine (no plastic or wire). Tied bundles are to be no more than 40 pounds and no longer than 4 foot in length.

Note: Tree limbs 6" to 10" in diameter and cut in 6" lengths will be accepted ONLY if the resident takes to the facility during hours of operation

NO CONTRACTORS/BUSINESSES PERMITTED

Contractors that provide proof that he/she is currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.

MULCH & LEAF COMPOST IS AVAILABLE FOR RESIDENCE TO PICK-UP

LEAF COMPOST AND WOODCHIPS (This Material is for Residential Use Only)

Leaf compost and woodchips will be free to residents during the hours listed above and while supplies last. You must present your driver's license or other form of identification showing you own a residence in the Township.

It will be your responsibility to load the material.

Reporting Street Light Outages

Be prepared to give a street address where the light is located. It is also helpful to them if you can provide the pole number, which is posted on each streetlight.



The Northeastern Senior Center is open Monday-Friday, 8am-2pm serving seniors 60 years of age and their spouse regardless of age. The membership is free and most programs, but lunch is by donation. It is a friendly, great place to socialize, meet others, and learn new, interesting things.

- **Currently, we need volunteer drivers for just Mondays, between 8:30am-10:30am.** It is unknown when we will resume 3x a week with hot meals for Home-Delivered Meals (Meals on Wheels) clients, but could be as early as 2023 and additional volunteers will be needed. When we return to hot meals, deliveries are 10:30am-12:30pm that include Wednesdays & Fridays. You will need a Valid Driver’s license, registration, & insurance to register and a criminal background check will be done.

If you are over 60 years of age and in need of Home-Delivered meals you must call the area agency on aging at 717-771-9610. If you are not homebound, but need meals, you can register as a member, then eat lunch with us or pick up meals at the center between 10am – 11am by ordering one business day in advance by 10am.

Fairview Township encourages all residents with special needs (e.g. deaf or blind) use a wheelchair or walker, use medical equipment, oxygen, ventilator, etc.) to register with York County Special Needs Registry. York County will forward information pertinent to emergency response and planning efforts to the Township. Additional information regarding the York County Special Needs Registry is below.

The York County Special Needs Registry is a free, confidential, and voluntary program offered by the Office of Emergency Management to aide local municipalities in identifying those residents in their communities who may need additional assistance during an emergency or disaster, as required by state law. This includes, but is not limited to, individuals:

- with mobility difficulties
- with sight or hearing impairments
- without a reliable or consistent form of transportation
- with intellectual or development disabilities
- with special medical equipment
- without access to emergency information via TV, radio, internet

Any information provided is collected into a spreadsheet and then forwarded on to Municipal Emergency Management Agencies to assist in emergency planning and response efforts. The registry can be used for more than just evacuation purposes – the information it provides is also helpful in any emergency situation (fire, chemical spill, police incident, etc.). All information is secure and confidential.

Codes Administration Office

The Codes Administration Office is responsible for many different functions within the Township including, but not limited to, administration and/or enforcement of the subdivision/land development ordinance, zoning ordinance, and the adopted building codes.

As warmer weather approaches and “honey-do-lists” start to pick back up, please remember the following:

- Grass is permitted to grow to a maximum of 8 inches in height in residential districts before a violation occurs.
- A permit is required for re-roofing a home, adding an accessory structure, adding a deck, or changing/upgrading your electrical service.

UNSURE IF YOU NEED A CONTRACTOR

When hiring a contractor, the homeowner or contractor must apply for a permit about three weeks before the work begins. Building permits can take up to 15 business days because they are reviewed by a third party agency. If the contractor applies for a permit, the homeowner must ask the contractor for the permit to be displayed in the window of the residence. If the contractor does not get a permit, the homeowner is still legally responsible. If you have any questions as to whether a permit is required for the work to be done or if you have a problem with the actual permit, please call the Building/Zoning & Codes department at (717) 901-5220. Be sure of the permit and its cost before you pay a contractor for it!

Residential Building Permits - Not sure what type of Building Permit You Need?
Fairview Township requires permits for many types of construction and building work in residential structures.

Some jobs will require only a “Zoning Permit” and other jobs will require a “Building Permit”. These are separate permits with their own applications. Zoning permits fall under Township rules and ordinances. Building permits fall under Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and require inspection. Keep in mind, permits take time to review and process. Please allow up to seven business days for Zoning permits and three weeks for Building permits.

EXAMPLES OF WORK REQUIRING A ZONING PERMIT	EXAMPLES OF WORK REQUIRING A BUILDING PERMIT	EXAMPLES OF WORK NOT REQUIRING ANY PERMIT
Construction and/or installation of a fence.	Building an addition onto your house, including attached garages and carports.	Repair to existing structures such as floorboards in a deck.
Construction and/or installation of a shed, unattached carport, or unattached garage, under 400 square feet.	Above ground and in ground swimming pools, even "wall-less" and portable pools! Any pool that is deeper than 24" needs a permit to put it back up every year.	Replacing or installing siding on a house.
Construction and/or installation of a patio, including paver patio or porch with no roof or walls.	Adding a roof to a patio, porch, or deck.	Replacing windows and doors with new one of the same size.
Construction and/or installation of a walkway on the property other than the sidewalk along the street. (This required a different permit.)	Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is more than 30" from the ground at any point.	Replacing a garage door (however, replacing a manual door with an electric door will require and electrical permit).
Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is not more than 30" high.	Installation of doors and windows, if the new doors and windows are a different size.	Wallpaper, carpet, tile, paint, and interior cabinetry such as kitchen cabinets.

PLEASE DO NOT BLOW GRASS INTO THE ROAD

When mowing your lawn, keep in mind it is illegal to blow the clippings onto the street. You are required to remove them from the street when finished. Section 252-35, B of the Fairview Township Stormwater Management Ordinance states:

"No person shall allow or cause to allow, discharges into the MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) or discharges into waters of the Commonwealth, which are not composed entirely of stormwater."

Grass clippings left in the street are washed away by stormwater and deposited in the stormwater system causing storm drains to clog, back up and flood. The grass also releases nitrogen into the stormwater system and ends up in our local waterways. Equally important is the impact this has to the environment and the unsafe conditions it can cause the traveling public, especially motorcyclists and bicyclists.

Please note that the Fairview Township Yard Waste Recycling Facility DOES NOT accept grass clippings! The best option is to mulch the clippings when you mow rather than gathering the clippings.



The York County Solid Waste Authority's FREE Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Event will be held on Saturday, May 6 from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. The event will be held behind the Authority's Recycle Drop-Off Area located at 2685 Blackthorne Court, York. Registration is required. Online registration is available for residents at:

<https://www.eventbrite.com/e/york-county-household-hazardous-waste-collection-event-tickets-565454689197> until May 5.

While attending the event, all participants must remain in their vehicles and contain all collection materials in the trunk or bed of vehicle (not the back seat). Materials will be removed from vehicle trunk/bed by event staff. No smoking is permitted at any time during the event.

Household hazardous waste includes products from the home that are corrosive (drain cleaners or bleach), flammable (gasoline), reactive (chemistry kits) or toxic (pesticides). The HHW Collection Event benefits York County by identifying hazardous wastes found in the home and providing an opportunity to manage these materials in a safe and efficient manner. All York County homeowners or residential tenants are eligible to take advantage of this event. There is no fee to participate. Business and government entities are not eligible to participate. The program is made possible by funding generated from tipping fees collected at the York County Resource Recovery Center and a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. After collection, a licensed hazardous waste commercial hauler will transport the material to permitted hazardous waste sites. These facilities will recycle the materials to the greatest extent possible.

YCSWA facilitates responsible solid waste management through an integrated strategy that emphasizes waste reduction, education, recycling, and resource recovery. YCSWA is the owner of the York County Resource Recovery Center, a Small Load Drop off Facility, a Recyclable Materials Drop-off Center, an Ash Recycling & Processing Facility, an Education Center, and the closed York County Sanitary Landfill which hosts the Hopewell Area Recreational Complex. 



The West Shore Historical Society (WSHS) is the recognized historical society for Fairview, Lower Allen, Hampden and Silver Spring Townships and the Boroughs of Lemoyne and Wormleysburg. We are pleased to announce an exciting project taking place in Fairview. Shayne Reed, a Fairview resident, is working on a mapping project of historical sites in the township. Shayne's family has resided in Fairview for over 200 years, and he has a strong interest in the history of the area.

Shayne has taken a map of Fairview from 1860 and overlaid it onto a current map of the township. He has worked to locate each of the sites that are still standing and is now researching and documenting the history of these places. The finished project will be published on the West Shore Historical Society website – www.westshorehistoricalsociety.org and will be made available to the township.

RENT-A-KID PROGRAM County of York, Pennsylvania Area Agency on Aging

This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist older adults in completing routine light-duty household chores and yard work such as mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the Rent-A-Kid program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.



Adults age 60 and older in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for youth in their area. It is the responsibility of the older adult to contact the youth and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is at least minimum wage. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the older adult to pay, the youth may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.
