REPORTING STREET LIGHT OUTAGES

PLEASE DO NOT BLOW GRASS ONTO THE ROAD

When mowing your lawn, keep in mind it is illegal to blow the clippings onto the street. You are required to remove them from the street when finished. Section 252-35, B of the Fairview Township Stormwater Management Ordinance states:

"No person shall allow or cause to allow, discharges into the MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) or discharges into waters of the Commonwealth, which are not composed entirely of stormwater."

Grass clippings left in the street are washed away by stormwater and deposited in the stormwater system causing storm drains to clog, back up and flood. The grass also releases nitrogen into the stormwater system and ends up in our local waterways. Equally important is the impact this has to the environment and the unsafe conditions it can cause the traveling public, especially motorcyclists and bicyclists.

Please note that the Fairview Township Yard Waste Recycling Facility **DOES NOT** accept grass clippings! The best option is to mulch the clippings when you mow rather than gathering the clippings. Codes Administration Office

The Codes Administration Office is responsible for many different functions within the Township including, but not limited to, administration and/or enforcement of the subdivision/land development ordinance, zoning ordinance, and the adopted building codes.

As warmer weather approaches and “honey-do-lists” start to pick back up, please remember the following:

- Grass is permitted to grow to a maximum of 8 inches in height in residential districts before a violation occurs.
- A permit is required for re-roofing a home, adding an accessory structure, adding a deck, or changing/upgrading your electrical service.

Deck Safety

Now's the time to take a closer look at the place where you will host many of your warm-weather gatherings. Simple upkeep can prevent your deck from collapsing, falling apart, and possibly causing injuries to your friends and family. Take a few minutes to inspect your deck and fix any problems before inviting everyone over.



Here is a list of a few things you can check:

- **Materials** - Check for split or decaying wood. Inspect for cracks and/or spongy wood. Keep an eye out for holes, which could mean insects have burrowed in and made a home.
- **Ledger Board** - Check all weight-bearing boards that connect the deck to your house to make sure it is attached with ½-inch galvanized-steel lag screws and through bolts, rather than nails, which can pop out. Check for any widened gaps between the house and the ledger, which may signal the bolts need tightening.
- **Flashing** – Prevents moisture from building up and causing rot. Check flashing around the ledger board, look to see if it has pulled away from the house. Make sure caulk that seals overlapping pieces of flashing is intact, and inspect for mud or debris stuck between the spacer and exterior wall.
- **Railings and Balusters** – Firmly grasp and wiggle these to make sure they are secure.
- **Support Posts** – Look for the connections between the posts and the deck’s beams. Tighten and replace 1/2 –inch through bolts as needed. Posts should be 6 inches square or larger, and no taller than 14 feet.
- **Surface Finish** – Look for any mildew or areas where water does not bead up on contact. If you find any, power-wash the deck with a solution of one part bleach (use only oxygenated bleach for cedar decks), three to five parts water, and laundry soap. Let it dry before applying a new layer of penetrating waterproof finish.



YARD WASTE GUIDELINES

DIRECTIONS:

From I-83, take exit 39A, turn left onto Lewisberry Road, in approximately 2 miles turn right onto Spanglers Mill Road, facility will be on your left.

DISPOSAL AT FACILITY:

- You must be a Township resident with residential refuse service
- Township employees do not load or unload material(s)
- You must present a valid driver's license or other valid ID with your name and address
- A Township employee will tell you if your yard waste is acceptable and may be unloaded.
- No dumping of yard waste permitted when the facility is closed.

ITEMS ACCEPTED

Tree limbs 6" diameter, 40 lbs.
Brush up to 4' in length
Plants and flowers
Shrubbery and pruning's
Christmas trees
(Tinsel & ornaments removed)

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

Soil or Sod
Grass Clippings
Limbs over 6" diameter
Tree stumps
Construction debris
Bricks, stone, concrete
Food Waste

PREPARATION FOR ITEMS ACCEPTED

Cut limbs/branches to 4-foot lengths. Place all acceptable yard waste in containers or bundle trimmings with rope, string or twine (no plastic or wire). Tied bundles are to be no more than 40 pounds and no longer than 4 foot in length.

* * * Tree limbs from 6" to 10" in diameter and cut in 6" lengths will be accepted * * *
ONLY if the resident takes to the facility during hours of operation

NO CONTRACTORS/BUSINESSES PERMITTED

Contractors that provide proof that he/she is currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.

MULCH & LEAF COMPOST IS AVAILABLE FOR RESIDENCE TO PICK-UP

LEAF COMPOST AND WOODCHIPS (This Material is for Residential Use Only)

Leaf compost and woodchips will be free to residents during the hours listed above and while supplies last. You must present your driver's license or other form of identification showing you own a residence in the Township. It will be your responsibility to load the material.

Household hazardous waste products (HHW) are items that are corrosive, flammable, reactive or toxic. HHW products are to be disposed of through York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA). You can either drop off or use their "At your door special collection service". For more information, please contact the York County Solid Waste Authority at 717-845-1066.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FOR DISPOSAL

PAINT: Latex and oil-based paint can be disposed of in your regular household trash. Simply add shredded paper, sand or kitty litter in the can to absorb any liquid. Place paint can into your household trash bag.

PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION: Remove medications from original container and mix with an undesirable substance, such as used coffee grounds or kitty litter. (The medication will be less appealing to children and pets, and unrecognizable to people who may intentionally go through your trash).

COVID-19 INFECTED MATERIALS: Contact the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) or your physician.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: Contact your local fire department or BFPE International at (717) 741-9980.

MEDICAL WASTE & MEDICATIONS: Dispose of needles and lancets in a designated household medical waste disposal system, or a rigid, lidded container with lid taped shut and labeled "SHARPS – DO NOT RECYCLE" and place in regular garbage.

GASOLINE & KEROSENE: Check with local businesses like auto garages as well as Pep Boys, Auto Zone, Advanced Auto Parts, Target, Walmart, Etc.

RECHARGEABLE BATTERY DISPOSAL LOCATIONS: (Regular alkaline batteries are to be thrown into your household trash) Rechargeable batteries such as Nickel Cadmium (NiCd), Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) or Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) should be recycled.

Participants who bring a device containing mercury, such as a thermometer or thermostat, will receive a \$5 Lowe's gift card (one per household while supplies last).

While attending the event, all participants must remain in their vehicles and contain all collection materials in the trunk or bed of vehicle (not the back seat). Materials will be removed from vehicle trunk/bed by event staff. No smoking is permitted at any time during the event.

Household hazardous waste includes products from the home that are corrosive (drain cleaners or bleach), flammable (gasoline), reactive (chemistry kits) or toxic (pesticides). The HHW Collection Event benefits York County by identifying hazardous wastes found in the home and providing an opportunity to manage these materials in a safe and efficient manner. Visit <https://www.ycswa.com/accepted-not-accepted-hhw-event/> for a list of products that are and are not accepted at this event.

All York County homeowners or residential tenants are eligible to take advantage of this event. There is no fee to participate. Business and government entities are not eligible to participate. The program is made possible by funding generated from tipping fees collected at the York County Resource Recovery Center and a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. After collection, a licensed hazardous waste commercial hauler hired by the Authority will transport the material to permitted hazardous waste sites. These facilities will recycle the materials collected.

The Authority facilitates responsible solid waste management through an integrated strategy that emphasizes waste reduction, education, recycling and resource recovery. The Authority is the owner of the York County Resource Recovery Center, a small load drop off facility, a recyclable materials drop-off center, ash recycling & processing facility, the now closed York County Sanitary Landfill which hosts the Hopewell Area Recreational Complex and an education center.



Crime Reduction

The police department is proud to announce that serious crime continues to go down in Fairview Township. The Part One Offenses for the Uniform Crime Report include Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson. While we previously had well over 300 such incidents, we have seen that number dropping over the past several years. Part of the reason for this is due to proper police staffing combined with proactive patrols and enforcement. Below is a summary of our Part One Crimes over the past 15 years.



In 2021 we set a record low, with only 122 Part One incidents. Those crimes were Murder (1), Rape (3), Robbery (0), Assault (31), Burglary (5), Theft (78), Motor Vehicle Theft (4), Arson (0). While we never want to see anyone become a victim, it is positive that fewer people in Fairview Township have been or will become victims of serious crime.

NEWS AND UPDATES

It has been over 2 years since we've had "normal" hours of operation, but we are pleased to announce that as of April 5th, we will be open 5x a week again. There will be hot meals available for all these days. Fairview Township and American Legion Post 974 invite you to help us honor your family and friends from Fairview who have served our great country. The **Military Banner Program** salutes our brave men and women currently serving and those who have served in the military by creating a custom banner to be displayed along the streets throughout the township in honor of our hometown heroes. Applications can be found on our website or can be picked up at the Township Office (by appointment only) or at the American Legion located on Marsh Run Road. For more information you may contact Tom Semones with the American Legion at (717) 350-0481. The program includes: (1) One 24" x 36" double sided Military Banner to be displayed for all to see along the streets within the township, (1) single sided banner for your personal display, and can be viewed on the web at www.troopbanners.com/FairviewTownship with a one-time cost to join the program of \$150.00.

The PADEP will soon begin a large-scale water-quality sampling event in Fairview Township for the collection of water for the analysis of PFAS, volatile organic compounds, and inorganics. The goal of the project is to determine the source, extent, and pathways of PFAS in the township; especially since two compounds (PFOS and PFOA) will soon have maximum contaminant levels and are suspected carcinogens. The tentative start date will be the first half of April. PADEP will be working with HDR to visit residential, business, and commercial establishments that have private water supplies. Prior to any visit, the PADEP will send out a letter requesting permission to sample as well as a questionnaire about their well and treatment system. In general, the time to collect and process the samples should average 30 minutes. There is no cost to the well owner and results will be mailed to all who participate.

FirstEnergy’s electric companies (including Met-Ed, West Penn Power, and Penelec) are encouraging customers experiencing financial hardship to contact them as soon as possible to establish affordable payment arrangements or obtain assistance before winter utility disconnection moratoriums are lifted and shut-offs for nonpayment resume April 1.

Through the campaign “We’re Customers Just Like You,” personal experiences of the company’s Customer Service and Human Services employees are being highlighted in video, social media, and personalized emails to show customers they are dedicated to helping them get through challenging times.

Fairview Township encourages all residents with special needs (e.g. deaf or blind) use a wheelchair or walker, use medical equipment, oxygen, ventilator, etc.) to register with York County Special Needs Registry. York County will forward information pertinent to emergency response and planning efforts to the Township. Additional information regarding the York County Special Needs Registry is below.

The York County Special Needs Registry is a free, confidential, and voluntary program offered by the Office of Emergency Management to aide local municipalities in identifying those residents in their communities who may need additional assistance during an emergency or disaster, as required by state law. This includes, but is not limited to, individuals:

- with mobility difficulties
- with intellectual or developmental disabilities
- with sight or hearing impairments
- with special medical equipment
- without a reliable or consistent form of transportation
- without access to emergency information via TV, radio, internet



Any information provided is collected into a spreadsheet and then forwarded on to municipal Emergency Management Agencies to assist in emergency planning and response efforts.

The Registry can be used for more than just evacuation purposes -- the information it provides is also helpful in any emergency situation (fire, chemical spill, police incident, etc). All information is secure and confidential.

Pennsylvanians Encouraged to Protect Themselves Against Tick-Borne Diseases When Venturing Outdoors

Deer Tick Virus in ticks detected at high levels in additional locations around Pennsylvania

"Lyme Disease has been present in all 67 counties for some time, and unfortunately, the prevalence of the very serious Deer Tick Virus appears to be increasing in some tick populations," said DEP Secretary Patrick McDonnell.

"Pennsylvanians should learn about the threats posed by tick-borne diseases and take commonsense precautions so they can enjoy our abundant natural resources—and the many wonderful physical and mental health benefits of outdoor recreation—as safely as possible," said Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn.

The Deer Tick Virus, which is a type of [Powassan virus](#), is rare in the United States, but positive cases have increased in recent years. It is spread to people primarily by bites from infected ticks and does not spread person-to-person through coughing, sneezing, or touching.

Powassan virus can be transmitted from tick to human in as little as 15 minutes after a bite occurs, while other tick-borne diseases, such as Lyme Disease, take much longer to cause infection, often 24 hours or more after the tick attaches to the host. There are no vaccines to prevent or medicines to treat Powassan viruses. Preventing tick bites is the best way to reduce risk of infection and disease.

Recommended precautions for anyone venturing outdoors include:

- Apply tick repellents containing [permethrin](#) to clothing, and [EPA-registered insect repellents](#) such as DEET to exposed skin before entering the outdoors. Reapply as needed according to product label instructions.
- Wear light colored outer clothing and tuck shirts into pants, and pants into socks.
- Walk in the centers of trails, and avoid wooded and brushy areas with low-growing vegetation and tall grasses that may harbor ticks.
- After returning home, remove all clothing, take a shower, and place clothing into the dryer on high heat to kill any lingering ticks. Examine gear such as backpacks for ticks.
- Conduct a full-body tick check using a hand or full-length mirror, including hidden areas such as the scalp, ears, armpits, belly button, and between the legs.
- Check over any pets exposed to likely tick habitats each time they return indoors.
- If a tick is found attached to your skin, use tweezers to remove it carefully, including the head. Monitor for symptoms and contact your doctor with any questions.

WEST SHORE HISTORICAL SOCIETY WELCOMES FAIRVIEW TOWNSHIP

West Shore Historical Society (WSHS,) the recognized historical society for Wormleysburg, Lemoyne, Hampden, Lower Allen and Silver Spring is pleased to welcome Fairview Township! At the December 6, 2021 Board of Supervisor's Meeting, WSHS gave a presentation inviting Fairview Township to join our municipalities, at no cost to the Township. A motion was approved to accept our invitation.

WSHS is a non-profit, all volunteer, educational and historical organization dedicated to preserving and interpreting the heritage, landmarks, and artifacts of our member municipalities.

We first began working with Fairview Township in our efforts to save the Sheepford Road Bridge, which began in 2019. After over two years of our preservation efforts, York County has submitted an application for a PennDot TASA (Transportation Alternative Set Aside) Grant for funding to restore the bridge for pedestrian use. An announcement is expected in the spring.

The Sheepford Road Bridge is just one of the many projects WSHS has been involved in. We've been part of discussions about the future of the historic Peace Church in Hampden Township. We maintain the Wormleysburg kiosk featuring historical information about the Borough. We own a caboosé that we rescued from demolition that now sits at Lowther Field in Lemoyne.

We recently collaborated with the West Shore Photography Club and the Art Center School & Galleries of Mechanicsburg on a project entitled "Round & About with the West Shore Historical Society." WSHS provided the photography club with a list of historic sites in our municipalities and hosted several group trips. Sites included Basehore Farm, the Rebecca Bitner House, Peace Church and the Sheepford Road Bridge. The Opening Reception for the exhibit, featuring photos from these and other historic sites, took place on Friday March 4 and was well attended. The exhibit runs through the month of March. We invite you to visit the Art Center - the photos are amazing!

We recently received an Historical and Archival Records Care Grant from the PA Historical and Museum Commission. Over the next two years, we will use the funding to inventory, properly store, and digitize our archives.

Won't you join us in the effort to collect and preserve our legacy? WSHS is funded by membership dues, grants and contributions from businesses and individuals. We publish quarterly newsletters featuring articles and pictures related to the the history of our municipalities.

Our headquarters are located at 939 Kranzel Drive, Camp Hill, and we are open by appointment. We encourage you to contact us for a visit. You can see our resources or consider whether you have items that might be candidates to join the Society's growing collection. We are interested in connecting with Fairview residents with an interest in history.

Grass Clippings



Fruits & Vegetables



Tree Stumps



Dirt & Stones



How to Prepare Yard Waste

- Place yard waste in biodegradable brown paper bags or bundle it with biodegradable twine in easy-to-handle bundles.
 - Bundles may be no longer than 5 feet in length.
 - Bundles may not weigh more than 30 pounds each.
 - Bundles may not exceed 6 inches in diameter.
- Once prepared, yard waste must be placed at the curb on scheduled pick up day before 6:30 am.
- An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb.

Please prepare your yard waste properly.
Yard Waste in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected!

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES



- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (on scheduled dates) must be curbside by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than six (6) trash bags or containers will be collected per collection.
- Mobile Carts count as a total of three (3) bags or containers.
- Mobile Carts will be delivered in late 2021. You may begin using them once they are received.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curbside.

Mobile Trash Cart Delivery

for Fairview Township Residents



As part of the new contract, Penn Waste will be distributing mobile carts to the residents of Fairview Township for trash service. Residents should already have a 64 gallon mobile cart for recycling. Residents will begin seeing mobile carts delivered in December 2021. You may begin utilizing the cart once it is received.

- **Basic Service:** customers will receive one (1) 96 gallon mobile cart and up to 3 bags excess of the cart for trash service.


Penn Waste will be collecting the residents of Fairview Township with an automated side load truck. The utilization of the mobile cart is strongly encouraged. This will help our crews to better service you by providing automated collection of your trash and recycling.

Proper Mobile Cart Placement:

Please be advised that all mobile carts should be placed behind the curb. There should be nothing placed in the roadway that would impede or delay the removal of snow or ice from the road. The garbage truck arm has the capability to reach past the curb in order to pick up your cans.

Here are some tips to ensure a smooth collection process:

- Set mobile cart out by 6:00 AM the day of collection or AFTER 6:00 PM the night before.
- Place mobile cart with the lid handle and wheels pointing toward your residence.
- Do not place cart in the roadway.
- Do not block walkways with carts.
- Place carts at least THREE FEET APART from each other and mailboxes, fire hydrants, low hanging trees or shrubs, parked cars, or utility poles - so trucks can easily access the cart.
