GUIDELINES CONTINUED

PREPARATION FOR ITEMS ACCEPTED

Cut limbs/branches to 4-foot lengths. Place all acceptable yard waste in containers or bundle trimmings with rope, string or twine (no plastic or wire). Tied bundles are to be no more than 40 pounds and no longer than four (4) foot in length.

Note: Tree limbs 6" to 10" in diameter and cut in 6" lengths will be accepted ONLY if the resident takes to the facility during hours of operation.

GUIDELINES FOR USE

DIRECTIONS: From I-83, take exit 39A, turn left onto Lewisberry Road, in approximately 2 miles turn right onto Spanglers Mill Road, facility will be on your left.

The Yard Waste AND Electronics Recycle Center Are For Residential Use Only!

NO CONTRACTORS/BUSINESSES PERMITTED
If a contractor can provide proof that he/she is currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident, they will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.

DISPOSAL AT FACILITY:

- You must be a township resident
- Township employees do not load or unload material(s)
- You must present a valid driver's license or other valid ID with your name and address
- A township employee will tell you if your yard waste is acceptable and may be unloaded.
- No dumping of yard waste permitted when the facility is closed.

Items Accepted

- Tree limbs 6" in diameter, 40 lbs.
- Brush up to 4' in length
- Plants and Flowers
- Shrubbery and Pruning's
- Christmas tree's (No Tinsel/Lights/Ornaments)



Items NOT Accepted

- Soil or Sod
- Grass Clippings
- Limbs over 6" Diameter
- Tree Stumps
- Food Waste
- Bamboo
- Construction Debris (Bricks, Stone, Concrete)

DO NOT BLOW GRASS INTO THE ROAD

When mowing your lawn, keep in mind it is illegal to blow the clippings onto the street. You are required to remove them from the street when finished. Section 252-35, B of the Fairview Township Stormwater Management Ordinance states:



"No person shall allow or cause to allow, discharges into the MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) or discharges into waters of the Commonwealth, which are not composed entirely of stormwater."

Grass clippings left in the street are washed away by stormwater and deposited in the stormwater system causing storm drains to clog, back up and flood. The grass also releases nitrogen into the stormwater system and ends up in our local waterways. Equally important is the impact this has to the environment and the unsafe conditions it can cause the traveling public, especially motorcyclists and bicyclists.

Please note that the Fairview Township Yard Waste Recycling Facility **DOES NOT** accept grass clippings! The best option is to mulch the clippings when you mow rather than gathering the clippings. Codes Administration Office

The Codes Administration office is responsible for many functions within Fairview Township, including, but not limited to, the administration of Subdivision/Land Development Ordinances, administration and enforcement of the Zoning Ordinances as well as the issuance of Building and Zoning permits within Fairview Township.

SUMMER IS COMING

Property Maintenance reminders:

- Maintain grass (Keep 8 inches or shorter)
- Maintain height of trees branches hanging over sidewalks and roadways.
- Trash Receptacles must be removed from curb within 24 hours of scheduled pick-up day.

Fairview Township currently utilizes a 3rd Party agency – Approved Code Services Inc. to conduct all the required building code reviews and inspections. All building code plan submittals are to be made to the township offices and will be forwarded to Approved Code Services for their review and approval. PA UCC mandates that residential reviews be conducted within a maximum of fifteen (15) business days and commercial reviews within thirty (30) business days.

EXAMPLES OF WORK REQUIRING A ZONING PERMIT

- Construction and/or installation of a fence.
- Construction and/or installation of a shed, unattached carport, or unattached garage, under 400 square feet.
- Construction and/or installation of a patio, including paver patio or porch with no roof or walls.
- Construction and/or installation of a walkway on the property other than the sidewalk along the street.
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is less than 30" high.
- Widening, replacing or adding newly paved areas to an existing driveway.

EXAMPLES OF WORK REQUIRING A BUILDING PERMIT

- Building an addition onto your house, including attached garages and carports.
- Above ground and in ground swimming pools, even "wall-less" and portable pools! Any pool that is deeper than 24" needs a permit to put it back up every year.
- Adding a roof to a patio, porch, or deck.
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is more than 30" from the ground at any point.
- Installation of doors and windows, if the new doors and windows are a different size.
- Putting new shingles on your roof.
- Plumbing, Mechanical or Electrical.

EXAMPLES OF WORK **NOT** REQUIRING ANY PERMIT

- Repair to existing structures such as floorboards in a deck.
- Replacing or installing siding on a house.
- Replacing windows and doors with new ones of the same size.
- Replacing a garage door (however, replacing a manual door with an electric door will require an electrical permit).
- Wallpaper, carpet, tile, paint, and interior cabinetry such as kitchen cabinets.

National Drug Take Back Day April 27, 2024

The Fairview Township Police Department is once again partnering with the DEA, the York Opioid Collaborative, and the West Shore School District to host National Drug Take Back day on April 27th from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm at Crossroads Middle School, 535 Fishing Creek Road. We will have this set up in front of the school. You will be able to drive through and hand off the medications to be disposed of without having to get out of your car. This is the time you can safely dispose of all unused, old, and/or expired prescription medications. This helps to curb prescription drug abuse by ensuring these old medications do not end up in the wrong hands. Please note you may also drop off vape pens and e-cigarette devices as well, but only after the batteries have been removed.





Pennsylvania Urban Nutrient Management – Be Green While Protecting Our Streams

Protecting Pennsylvania's Waterways Starts at Home.

Turfgrass has become a major component of Pennsylvania's flora. In fact, according to DCNR, Pennsylvania now contains over 2 million acres of lawn. Selecting a proper turfgrass management program, whether it is on a private lawn, sports field, public park, or golf course, is essential to protecting our local waterways.

Know What Your Lawn Needs

When looking to apply nutrients to your lawn, make sure you are aware of what your lawn needs and what the Pennsylvania Fertilizer Law allows. To determine your lawn's nutrient needs, it is best to first soil test. Soil tests provide specific recommendations for nitrogen, phosphate, and potassium. Following the soil test recommendations ensures that you are applying only what your lawn needs, thus reducing nutrient loss and fertilizer cost. Test kits can be purchased for a nominal fee from your local [Penn State extension office](#).

The Pennsylvania Fertilizer Law

In July 2022, Pennsylvania adopted a new [fertilizer law](#) designed to minimize the movement of nutrients into our waterways. Anyone who applies fertilizers should be aware of the following nutrient limitations.

- Nitrogen is limited to 0.9 pounds of total nitrogen and 0.7 pounds of available nitrogen per 1000 ft² per application.
- No phosphorus can be applied unless establishing or repairing turf.
- Both the nitrogen and phosphorus rates can be adjusted based on soil test recommendations and/or if using an enhanced efficiency fertilizer.
 - Enhanced efficiency fertilizers are specifically designed to reduce nutrient losses to the environment while increasing availability to plants.

In addition, when applying fertilizer, applicators must follow specific environmental conditions to prevent direct movement of fertilizer nutrients into our streams.

- Do not apply if a heavy rain is expected.
- Keep fertilizer away from drainage ditches, storm drains, or water.
- Maintain a 15-foot buffer from the banks of all waterways.
- Remove fertilizer that lands on impervious surfaces (i.e. driveways, sidewalks, roads) back onto the application area.
- Do not use as a snow or ice melt.
- Do not spread fertilizer on snow-covered or frozen ground.
- Fertilizer application between December 15 and March 1 is restricted to 0.50 lbs of total nitrogen per 1000 ft² per application.

Read the Label

Manufacturers of fertilizer products must include detailed labels that provide the nutrient content and instructions for use. As a fertilizer applicator, you are strongly encouraged to read and follow all directions and apply your fertilizer using a properly calibrated spreader.

Lawn Care Considerations

Nutrient management is not the only tool that can be used for limiting nutrient loss. There are many additional lawn care considerations that can be used to promote a healthy lawn while protecting our local waterways. A few examples are listed below.

Fertilizer may not be the solution. If your lawn is not looking as healthy and green as you would like, sometimes fertilizer is not the answer. Applying fertilizer without understanding the underlying soil can result in a waste of money and nutrients. There are many soil health factors that play a critical role in maintaining your lawn. Reducing soil compaction can improve root growth and water infiltration. Maintaining an appropriate soil pH is essential to promoting proper nutrient availability. Soil texture and organic matter content influence water movement, nutrient availability, and the microbial ecosystem of the soil. A healthy soil supports a healthy lawn.

Raise your mower deck. Set your mower deck to 3 inches or higher. A taller lawn provides shade that discourages weed growth and promotes strong root development helping lawns to withstand environmental stress. Alternatively, you can use [low mow turf](#) species, such as fine fescue blends, that do best when mowing is limited. A taller, healthier lawn slows water movement and increases infiltration keeping moisture, soil, and nutrients where they are needed most.

Mulch your grass clippings. Keeping your clippings in place returns valuable organic matter and nutrients to your lawn.

Provide a buffer. Do not mow up to the banks of streams. Maintaining vegetative buffers along waterways provides wildlife habitat while slowing and filtering water before it enters the stream.

Convert your lawn. Replacing turf with native vegetation not only increases water infiltration, but also promotes biodiversity and creates habitats for pollinators and other wildlife. [For more information on Lawn Conversion visit DCNR's website.](#)



Yard Waste Is...

material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation not listed below.



How to Prepare Yard Waste

1. Place yard waste in biodegradable brown paper bags or bundle it with biodegradable twine in easy-to-handle bundles.
 - Bundles may be no longer than 4 feet in length.
 - Bundles may not weigh more than 30 pounds each.
 - Branches may not exceed 6 inches in diameter.
2. Once prepared, yard waste must be placed at the curb on scheduled pick up day before 6:00 am.
3. An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb.

DO NOT place these items out for yard waste collection:

Grass Clippings

Fruits & Vegetables

Tree Stumps

Dirt & Stones



Please prepare your yard waste properly.

Yard Waste in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected!
