The new yard waste facility located at 285 Spangler's Mill Road will open to the public on Tuesday, February 1, 2022.

Fall/Winter Hours: Monday – Friday and the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month: 9:00 A.M. TO NOON

EXCEPTION – PLEASE NOTE: The center follows the same Holiday Schedule for closings as the Township office.

Spring/Summer hours begin on April 4, 2022. (Mon.-Sat., 8:00 am to 4:30 pm)

You can drop off Yard Waste and Electronics Recycling as well as pick up mulch.

The current location at 55 Fairview Road will close permanently on Monday, January 31, 2022.

Please Note:

1. You must reside in York County to utilize the electronics-recycling center
2. Residents are responsible for cleaning /removing personal information from the computer hard drives before dropping off to be recycled.
3. Residents are responsible to unload any items being dropped off for recycling.
4. No items from commercial business will be accepted.
5. There is currently no limit to the number of items a single household can recycle.



SNOW SEASON IS HERE - HERE ARE A FEW IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Plows & Driveways:

Plows travel down the right side of the roadway, the same direction as normal traffic flow. There is no way to avoid plows putting snow at the end of driveways. To minimize the amount of snow placed by a plow, put shoveled snow on the right side of the driveway as you look from your driveway into the street.



Throwing snow back into the street after plowing is illegal and a violation of township ordinance. All portable basketball hoops MUST be removed from streets, this is also a violation of township ordinance.

- 2) Or, text the word **FAIRVIEWTWP** to 888777. (if enrolling by text be sure to click on **FAIRVIEW TWP**)




Reporting Street Light Outages

All outages should be reported directly to them. Be prepared to give a street address where the light is located. It is also helpful to them if you can provide the pole number that is posted on each street light.

A New Leash on Life

The York County SPCA accepts and cares for resident owner's surrendered animals and attempts to find those animals permanent and loving homes. They accept stray animals from residents and Animal Control Officers that are transported to the shelter. In the last year the Humane Society Policy Officer investigated and supported prosecution of 132 animal cruelty or neglect cases. SPCA provides low-cost spay/neuter surgeries, including programs for free roaming cats and cat colonies. Provides residents with discounted spay/neuter surgeries for high-volume, low-cost. The Spay/Neuter Clinic completed 9,360 spay/neuter surgeries in the last year. SPCA provides the following programs to residents at little to no cost:

CARMA program supports low-income families provide medical treatments for their pets at discounted costs.

SafePet offers free refuge for people's pets if they must flee a domestic violence situation or temporary housing issues/loss.

Pet Pantry program ensures families suffering from food insecurity can feed their pets at no cost to the family.

Community Cat Initiative is an impactful new program that offers a long-term solution to York County's community cat overpopulation issues.

Second Chance Fund provides free veterinary care for sick and injured animals.

The York County SPCA also provides yearly and lifetime dog licensing, microchip and rabies vaccination clinics. They also provide no cost humane education programs and events for York County residents. Any sick and/or injured stray animal that needs care outside of normal York County SPCA business hours should seek assistance at the Animal Emergency and Referral Center of York or Mason Dixon Animal Hospital.

On-lot Septic Management

As part of Fairview Township's Act 537 Plan and approved by PA DEP, Chapter 18, Part 6 requires that on-lot septic systems must be pumped at least once every four (4) years. The Township is broken up into four (4) septic zones, with Zone 3 due for pumping in 2022. To find out what zone you are located in, please visit the Fairview Township website and locate the Septic Zone map. If you are located within Zone 3 and have had your septic tank pumped within the last 4 years then disregard this reminder, as long as the township was copied with your pumping manifest.

As a property owner, you are required to:

- Have your system pumped and inspected by a certified pumping hauler.
- Have the pumping company that you chose send the Septic System Report (Manifest Report) to the Township within 30 days of the pumping.

Again, if your property is within Zone 3 and your system has been pumped within 4 years, please disregard any correspondence you may receive, as long as the township was copied with your pumping manifest. *****INSPECTIONS DUE BY MARCH 15, 2022*****

Post Construction Stormwater Management Best Management Practices (PCSM BMPs) inspections are due to Fairview Township by March 15th. Attn: Homeowners, HOA's and/or Business/Property Owners - If you have a stormwater BMP on your property, you may be responsible for the ongoing inspection and maintenance of that facility. Examples of these include, but are not limited to: Detention/Retention Ponds, Infiltration Ponds, Infiltration Pits, Swales, Infiltration Berms, Stormwater Quality Inlets, and others. These facilities require proper operation and maintenance to ensure they are functioning properly. Inspection forms are available on the MS-4/Stormwater page of the Fairview Township website. These inspection forms are due by March 15th of each calendar year. A Note from the Building/Zoning and Codes Department:

WITH THE WINTER MONTHS UPON US, HERE ARE A FEW ITEMS TO KEEP IN MIND THIS TIME OF THE YEAR:

SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

Fairview Township Ordinances require owners, occupants and/or tenants of a property with a sidewalk that runs adjacent to a public street, to remove any snow and/or ice within 12 hours after the snow or ice event. Please keep in mind that these areas are used by pedestrians and for schoolchildren to get back and forth to a bus stop. Unfortunately, many times after the snow plows come through to remove the snow from the street, these areas may need cleared again.



ADDRESSES AND PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION

Please remember to verify that your address is plainly visible, identifiable, and legible. Remember not to allow snow, decorations, bushes, etc., to block, cover, or in any way conceal the identifying numbers visibility from the roadway. Fairview Township EMS has blue or green reflective address signs available for sale for \$20.00 at www.fairviewems.org or by calling (717) 932-2260.



**MANY RESIDENTS WILL TURN TO THEIR WOOD STOVES AND FIREPLACES TO PROVIDE SOME MUCH NEEDED WARMTH!
HERE ARE SOME REMINDERS TO ENSURE THE SAFE OPERATION OF THESE HEAT SOURCES:**

- Prior to starting your wood stove or fireplace, have a chimney sweep clean and inspect it. You may have had a chimney fire and not even been aware of it (if the flue is damaged it may be covered under your homeowner's policy)!
- Be aware of the type of wood you are purchasing. There are many reputable wood suppliers, but there are also those who sell green and/or soft wood at the same price as good, seasoned hard woods. Green and soft woods are hard to burn and can lead to a build-up of creosote.
- Storage of wood is also important. If it is to be stored outside, it should be covered and kept dry. Wet and frozen wood is hard to burn and may lead to a build-up of creosote.
- A good practice to prevent creosote build-up: After running the stove on low overnight, run it hot in the morning for 10 to 15 minutes. If you have a thermometer on the stovepipe, get it to between 400 and 500 degrees. Do this daily. This will generally crystallize the creosote so it falls back into the stove. To be sure of safe operation, have the chimney cleaned periodically as well.

REMINDER

Building permits are required for wood stoves, chimneys, fireplaces (gas or wood), and replacement of furnaces. The Building Department staff is here to help you and to make sure any projects are completed according to PA U.C.C. requirements. The "Home Delivered Meals Program" is designed to provide a daily well-balanced meal To homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and Have no means for assuring healthful nutrition. In order to provide a meal for each day of the week, meals will be delivered to the older adult's home as follows:

Monday – 1 hot meal & 1 bagged lunch (for Tues.)

Wednesday – 1 hot meal, 1 bagged lunch (for Thurs.), & 1 frozen meal (for Sun.)

Friday – 1 hot meal & 1 bagged lunch (for Sat.)



Volunteers from the local senior center delivers the meals to the older adult's home. The Northeastern Senior Center is seeking volunteers for home delivered meals, please call (717) 266-1400 if you are interested. Although this is a brief contact it does provide a check on the wellbeing of the homebound individual. The home delivered meal service is not a cost shared service. Monetary donations can be made to the York County Agency on Aging. Care Managers need to complete an in-home assessment to determine eligibility for home delivered meals.

To Be Eligible for Home Delivered Meals Services an individual must be:

- A York County Resident in a non-institutional setting.
- 60 years of age or older.
- Have a physical, mental or emotional disability, which prohibits the individual from leaving his/her residence on a regular basis and/or prevents them from preparing a nutritious meal.
- Living alone or with someone who also meets the above criteria.

The "Fairview Feeding Families" program is a way for Fairview Township Employees to show their appreciation to Township residents during the holiday season. 

Penn Waste 2022 Refuse and Recycling Holiday Schedule Delays

Memorial Day – Mon. 5/30 | Independence Day – Mon. 7/4 | Labor Day – Mon. 9/5 | Thanksgiving Day – Thurs. 11/24

NOTE: If your regularly scheduled collection day falls on or after one of the above listed holiday's you can expect your service to be delayed one (1) day the day of the holiday and the remainder of that week.

EXCEPTION: There is no service interruption for Holiday's that fall on a Saturday or Sunday.

2022 Curbside Yard Waste Pick-up will begin Saturday, April 2nd through November 5th.

(June's yard waste pick-up will be the second Saturday)

The newly provided 96-gallon trash totes are not required and residents who wish to return them should contact Penn Waste to arrange pick-up/removal of the toter.

Effective January 1st, 2022 Penn Waste increased quarterly rates per home by \$0.60 per quarter due to an increase in disposal rates of \$2.50/ton at the York County Resource Recovery Facility also effective January 1st, 2022. The new Quarterly rate for Fairview Township will be \$68.07 per quarter.



Mobile Trash Cart Delivery

for Fairview Township Residents



As part of the new contract, Penn Waste will be distributing mobile carts to the residents of Fairview Township for trash service. Residents should already have a 64 gallon mobile cart for recycling. Residents will begin seeing mobile carts delivered in December 2021. You may begin utilizing the cart once it is received.

- **Basic Service:** customers will receive one (1) 96 gallon mobile cart and up to 3 bags excess of the cart for trash service.


Penn Waste will be collecting the residents of Fairview Township with an automated side load truck. The utilization of the mobile cart is strongly encouraged. This will help our crews to better service you by providing automated collection of your trash and recycling.

Proper Mobile Cart Placement:

Please be advised that all mobile carts should be placed behind the curb. There should be nothing placed in the roadway that would impede or delay the removal of snow or ice from the road. The garbage truck arm has the capability to reach past the curb in order to pick up your cans.

Here are some tips to ensure a smooth collection process:

- Set mobile cart out by 6:00 AM the day of collection or AFTER 6:00 PM the night before.
- Place mobile cart with the lid handle and wheels pointing toward your residence.
- Do not place cart in the roadway.
- Do not block walkways with carts.
- Place carts at least THREE FEET APART from each other and mailboxes, fire hydrants, low hanging trees or shrubs, parked cars, or utility poles - so trucks can easily access the cart.

Observed holidays are noted in **RED**. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES



- Trash, Recycling, and one bulk item must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day, which is will remain the same.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Residents may place out 1 mobile cart and 3 bags of waste under this contract.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted by two people will not be accepted.
- Yard Waste will be collected on the 1st Saturday of the month from April and November. (See calendar above)
- Yard waste must not exceed 4 feet in lengths and must be bundled.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing Freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.

Important Trash and Recycling Information for Fairview Township Residents

Bulk Item Guidelines

Fairview Township residents may dispose of one (1) bulk item per week through curb side collection. Please have your waste, recycling, and bulk item available for collection at the curb by 6:00 am. We recommend placing your material curbside the evening before collection.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS – Appliances, furniture, mattresses, box springs, one (1) car tire without the rim, lawn mowers (oil and gasoline removed), plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) 4 ft. rolls of carpet (tied).

NON-ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS – Electronic Waste (computers, televisions, etc.) chemicals, stains, liquids, batteries, automobile parts, hazardous waste, tires on rims, commercial/industrial waste, construction materials (drywall, brick, block, lumber, shingles, tiles, concrete, etc.).

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS – Items which are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

Appliances with Freon will be collected by appointment only. Please call Penn Waste at 717-767-4456 to schedule collection. (Items include but are not limited to air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)

Yard Waste Collection Guidelines

Yard Waste is material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation not listed below.

For a full Yard Waste collection schedule, please refer to the calendar included.

How to Properly Dispose of Hot Ashes

It is important to keep safety in mind when handling hot ashes from wood stoves, fireplaces and fire pits. Hot ashes can cause major safety issues for not only you, but for our employees as well.

Hot ashes and coals from fires can remain hot enough to start fires for many hours or even days after a fire is out. The amount of time it takes for hot ashes to cool depends on many factors, some of which include how hot the fire was, what was burning, how much unburned fuel remains if fuel was used, etc. Please keep all of these factors in mind when disposing of hot ashes.

In order to properly dispose of the hot ashes, here are some tips to keep in mind:

- If possible, allow ashes to cool in the area where you had the fire for several days. These areas are designed to contain their heat safely.
- When it is time to dispose of ashes, test to ensure the hot ashes are cool by placing them in a **cardboard box or paper bag before disposal**. In this situation, never leave these ashes unattended until they are cool enough for disposal. If the ashes are too hot, they will begin to burn through the box or bag.
- **Transfer the cool ash to a plastic bag and then tie it shut**. This will ensure any dust from the bagged ashes does not get into our employees' eyes or lungs.
- Do NOT put any ashes in a trash container. They should be left on the ground beside your trash container. By sitting them outside of the cart, we can confirm the ashes are NOT hot before placing them in the truck.
- NEVER dispose of hot ashes with yard waste material. By placing ashes with yard waste, such as tree trimmings and leaves, the potential for fires increase substantially
