SNOW SEASON IS HERE - HERE ARE A FEW IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Plows & Driveways:

Plows travel down the right side of the roadway, the same direction as normal traffic flow. There is no way to avoid plows pushing snow into the end of driveways. To minimize the amount of snow pushed by a plow into your driveway, place shoveled snow on the right side of the driveway as you look into the street. Residents clearing their driveways may want to wait until the plows have completed the street and have pushed the snow back to the curb.

Throwing snow back into the street after plowing is illegal and a violation of township ordinance. All portable basketball hoops MUST be removed from streets; this is also a violation of township ordinance.

REMINDER TO ALL DOG OWNERS

All house pets should be kept indoors during cold weather. If you must keep them outdoors, provide a shelter off the ground with protection from the wind and keep unfrozen water available. If it's too cold out for you, then it's too cold out for your pet!

It is unlawful and NOT permitted to allow your dog to disturb the peace of citizens, residents, or others within the Township by allowing your dog to continuously bark, yelp, howl or cause any other unseemly noise; or permit a dog to make any loud or harsh noise or disturbance with such frequency. (Township Ordinance 127-7)

Reminder to all York County residents to renew and/or purchase your 2023 dog license. A dog license can be purchased online, by mail or in person at the Treasurer's Office, located at the York County Administrative Center, 28 E. Market St., York or a satellite sub-agent. Reporting Street Light Outages



The Township receives many calls from residents reporting streetlight outages. Streetlights are installed and maintained by the electric company. Any outages should be reported directly to the electric company. When reporting an outage, a street address where the light is located and a pole number is helpful (which is posted on each streetlight).

PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WINTER WEATHER?

HEATING

- Test all systems
- Clean any debris around unit
- Change filters
- Reverse Ceiling Fans
- Program thermostat to regulate temperatures when you are not home



FIREPLACE

- Clean and check dampers
- Stock up on firewood
- Inspect your chimney cap
- Ensure you have a fire extinguisher nearby



INSULATION

- Look for drafts
- Apply caulk/weather stripping where needed
- Remove and store window AC units
- Seal off crawl space



PLUMBING

- Winterize sprinkler systems
- Turn off outdoor spigots
- Detach and drain hose
- Insulate pipes and faucets
- Turn down your water heater



EXTERIOR

- Winterize and store lawn equipment, outdoor furniture, and grills
- Prepare ice melt, sand, snow shovels, and car scrapers
- Inspect roof for damage
- Clean out gutters



OTHER

- Test and replace batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors
- Bring plants and delicate trees indoors
- Replace old fire extinguishers

Safely Heat Your Home during the Frigid Winter Months

Make sure to follow these important tips before you plug in:

1. Place space heaters on flat, level surface, away from high traffic areas.
2. Never leave a space heater unattended.
3. Only use space heaters with the certification label of a nationally recognized testing lab.
4. Plug a space heater directly into an outlet and avoid using an extension cord.
5. Don't use a space heater if the plug is broken, or the cord is frayed, worn, or damaged.



Four home heating tips to live by:

1. Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from a heating source.
2. Have your heating system inspected annually.
3. Keep vents clear of dust and debris.
4. Install carbon monoxide (CO) alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning.



Space heaters cause 32% of home fires

More home fires occur during the cold winter months than at any other time of year

Fairview Township encourages all residents with special needs (e.g. deaf or blind, use a wheelchair or walker, use medical equipment, oxygen, ventilator, etc.) to register with York County Special Needs Registry. York County will forward information pertinent to emergency response and planning efforts to the Township.

The York County Special Needs Registry is a free, confidential, and voluntary program offered by the Office of Emergency Management to aid local municipalities in identifying those residents in their communities who may need additional assistance during an emergency or disaster, as required by state law.

This includes, but is not limited to, individuals:

- with mobility difficulties
- with intellectual or developmental disabilities
- with sight or hearing impairments
- with special medical equipment
- without a reliable or consistent form of transportation
- without access to emergency information via TV, radio, internet



Any information provided is collected onto a spreadsheet and forwarded to Municipal Emergency Management Agencies to assist in emergency planning and response efforts.

The registry can be used for more than just evacuation purposes - the information it provides is also helpful in any emergency situation (fire, chemical spill, police incident, etc.). All information is secure and confidential.

Home Delivered Meals

The "Home Delivered Meals Program" is designed to provide a well-balanced daily meal to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and have no means for assuring healthful nutrition. On Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, a hot meal is delivered to the older adult's home. Tuesday and Thursday meals are a cold-bagged lunch delivered with the previous day's hot meal. Volunteers from the local senior center deliver the meals to the older adult's home.



The Northeastern Senior Center is seeking volunteers for Home delivered meals, please call (717) 266-1400 if you are interested. The home delivered meal service is not a cost shared service. Monetary donations can be made to the York County Agency on Aging.



NEWS AND UPDATES

The Northeastern Senior Center is open Monday-Friday, 8am-2pm serving seniors 60 years of age and their spouse regardless of age. The membership is free and most programs, but lunch is by donation. It is a friendly, great place to socialize, meet others, and learn new, interesting things. Currently, we need volunteer drivers for just Mondays, between 8:30am-10:30am. It is unknown when we will resume three times a week with hot meals for Home-Delivered Meals (Meals on Wheels) clients, but could be as early as 2023 and additional volunteers will be needed. When we return to hot meals, deliveries are 10:30am-12:30pm that include Wednesdays & Fridays. You will need a Valid Driver's license, registration, & insurance to register.

If you are over 60 years of age and in need of Home-Delivered meals you must call the Area Agency on Aging at 717-771-9610. If you are not homebound, but need meals, you can register as a member, then eat lunch with us or pick up meals at the center between 10am-11am by ordering one business day in advance by 10am.

RENT-A-KID PROGRAM

Is sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging, brings older adults and teenagers together.

York County adults 60 years of age or older who need help with various household chores, including lawn mowing, yard work, snow removal, electronic devices and other odd jobs can contact the York County Area Agency on Aging to hire a teenager in their area.



The seniors are asked to reimburse the teens a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate based on the job. The

teenagers are York County students in grades 7 through 12 or homeschooled. They must complete an application and have it signed by their parent and school guidance counselor.

The teens are then entered into a regional database. When the older adults contact the agency, they are matched electronically with teenagers in their area. If a contractor can provide proof that they are currently doing work for a Fairview Township resident, they will be permitted to dispose of yard waste at the facility.

IMPORTANT REFUSE & RECYCLING DATES TO REMEMBER

Effective January 1, 2023 Penn Waste increased quarterly rates per home by \$0.45 per quarter due to an increase in disposal rates of \$2.00/ton at the York County Resource Facility also effective January 1st, 2023. The new quarterly rate for Fairview Township will be \$71.22 per quarter.

Policy for Large Item Pickup

For large items to be acceptable, they must be able to be lifted into a truck by two people. Loose piles are not able to be accepted. You must call Penn Waste to arrange for your large item pickup.

Acceptable Items

- Appliances such as Refrigerators and Washing Machines
- Carpet (48" max. length, rolled and tied)
- Furniture
- Mattresses & Box Springs
- Car Tires (TIRES ONLY. Must be removed from rims)
- Tree Branches & Brush (48" max. length, bundled and tied)
- Scrap Metal (48" max. length)



Non-Acceptable Items

- Paints, Stain, Chemicals and Liquids
- Batteries
- Automobile Parts
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Tires on Rims
- Commercial and Industrial Waste
- Construction Materials or Debris, including: Drywall, Brick, Block, Treated Lumber, Roofing, Shingles, Ceiling Tiles, Concrete

Use Dark Trash Bags

White trash bags blend in with the snow. Use darker bags or a trash can to ensure we see your trash.



Clear Access

Please make sure there is a clear, safe path for our employees to access your trash and recycling.



Windy Conditions

Extreme wind will knock your waste carts over. If your bins are not full, consider holding them until the next week. The carts will fall over from the wind after they've been emptied.

Children Playing in Snow

If you have children who are playing in the snow, please be mindful of them playing close to the streets since visibility may be impaired due to weather conditions.

Slow Down Before You Go Around

Observed holidays are noted in **RED**. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (on scheduled dates) must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than six (6) trash bags or containers will be collected per collection.
- Mobile Carts count as a total of three (3) bags or containers.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.


ON-LOT SEPTIC MANAGEMENT

As part of Fairview Township's Act 537 Plan as approved by PA DEP, Chapter 18, Part 6 requires that on-lot septic systems must be pumped at least once every four (4) years. The Township is divided into four (4) septic zones, with Zone 4 due for pumping in 2023. To find out what zone you are located in, please visit the Fairview Township website and locate the Septic Zone map. If you are located within Zone 4 and have had your septic tank pumped within the last 4 years then disregard this reminder, and provide a copy of your pumping manifest.

As a property owner, you are required to:

- Pump and inspect your system by a certified pumping hauler.
- Submit the Septic System Report (Manifest Report) to the Township within 30 days of the pumping.

You can view the full on-lot septic ordinance online at www.twp.fairview.pa.us. Again, if your property is within Zone 4 and your system has been pumped within 4 years, please disregard any correspondence you may receive, as long as the township was copied with your pumping manifest. 

****INSPECTIONS DUE BY MARCH 15, 2023****

Post Construction Stormwater Management Best Management Practices (PCSM BMPs) inspections are due to Fairview Township by March 15th. Attn: Homeowners, HOA's and/or Business/Property Owners - If you have a stormwater BMP on your property, you may be responsible for the ongoing inspection and maintenance of that facility. Examples of these include, but are not limited to: Detention/Retention Ponds, Infiltration Ponds, Infiltration Pits, Swales, Infiltration Berms, Stormwater Quality Inlets, and others. These facilities require proper operation and maintenance to ensure they are functioning properly. Inspection forms are available on the MS-4/Stormwater page of the Fairview Township website. These inspection forms are due by March 15th of each calendar year. The York County Recorder of Deeds, Laura Shue, would like to announce a public service to all York County Homeowners:

The Recorder of Deeds Office has been receiving a growing number of calls concerning deed and record safety.

As of October 1st, our office has implemented a “Records Notification Service” for all homeowners in York County.

The service is designed to provide security and assurance, no document is recorded without the homeowner’s knowledge.

Sign up is “FREE” at the York County website, Recorder of Deeds, webpage. There will never be a charge to sign up.

You will need to provide a valid email address and your property ID number found on your county tax bill or look up on the website. Your email address and property ID number are protected and not shared with any other sources through this program.

The homeowner will be alerted by email, when a document is recorded with their Property ID Number attached.

This service can identify fraudulent activity that may have occurred without the homeowner’s knowledge.

If you receive an alert, the program will guide you to another website to view the document. Should you choose to print from this website, there will be a small charge.

Please take advantage of this important safety service. It is easy to sign up and easy to unsubscribe at any time.

There is no risk to the homeowner by signing up, only the benefit of peace of mind.

TIPS FOR RESIDENTIAL HEATING OIL TANK OWNERS

Residential heating oil tanks are tanks used to store fuel oil to

Provide space heating on premises where they are located.

Leaking heating oil tanks can contaminate public and private

drinking water supplies, pollute soils, create the potential for fires

and explosions, and subject tank owners to very expensive

cleanup costs that are often NOT covered by typical

homeowner's insurance policies. With proper tank management, spills and leaks can be avoided.

How can heating oil tanks be protected from spills and overfills?

1.) Routinely inspect the exterior of an aboveground tank and all attached equipment.

2.) Install spill and overfill prevention devices.

3.) Ensure the tank address is clearly visible and the fill line is clearly marked.

4.) Consider a secondary containment structure.

Indicators that a residential heating oil tank might be leaking or product has been spilled.

- Soil is saturated with heating oil
- Soil or other surface material around the fill pipe is stained
- Product vapors are in the soils or in the basement area
- Fuel is seeping into a basement, stream, underground utility, etc.
- Drinking water supplies are contaminated
- Fuel consumption has suddenly increased
- Furnace is operating erratically; and
- Neighbors are complaining of fuel oil odors.
