SNOW SEASON IS UPON US - HERE ARE A FEW IMPORTANT REMINDERS

PLOWS & DRIVEWAYS

Plows travel down the right side of the roadway, the same direction as normal traffic flow. There is no way to avoid plows pushing snow into the end of driveways. To minimize the amount of snow pushed by a plow into your driveway, place shoveled snow on the right side of the driveway as you look into the street. Residents clearing their driveways may want to wait until the plows have completed the street and have pushed the snow back to the curb.

Throwing snow back into the street after plowing is illegal and a violation of township ordinance. All portable basketball hoops **MUST** be removed from streets; this is also a violation of township ordinance.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (on scheduled dates) must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than six (6) trash bags or containers will be collected per collection.
- Mobile Carts count as a total of three (3) bags or containers.
- Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 40 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.

HOW TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES

Rechargeable batteries, such as those found in common household items like cell phones, tablets, toys, electric toothbrushes, tools, and remote controls should NEVER be placed in your curbside trash and recycling bins because they start fires. For this reason, rechargeable batteries need to be handled with special care. In addition, many big box retailers accept rechargeable batteries. Some examples are Lowe's, Home Depot, and Staples.

- 03.** Transfer the cool ash to a plastic bag and tie it shut to ensure no dust gets out then place with your trash.
- 04.** Never dispose of hot ashes with yard waste.

COLD WEATHER PET SAFETY TIPS

As cold weather starts to hit, here are some helpful pet safety tips to keep your furry family members safe and warm this winter.

- 1.) Provide warm shelter for your pets – keep them inside if you can, or make sure their outdoor shelters are enclosed, weatherproof and has warm bedding.
- 2.) Make sure that your pet has access to clean, non-frozen, potable water.
- 3.) Keep dogs on leashes when walking – dogs can easily become lost and disoriented due to a reduction in scent cues on the ground.
- 4.) Dispose of antifreeze properly and thoroughly clean up spills – it's poisonous to animals!

The Fire Departments wants to remind residents to be fire safe through the holidays and winter months. One (1) in every seven (7) home fires involve heating equipment. Ensure you install carbon monoxide alarms and/or test existing ones at least once a month in your home.



Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.

Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!




As you deck the halls this season, be fire smart.



ON-LOT SEPTIC MANAGEMENT

As part of Fairview Township's Act 537 Plan as approved by PA DEP, Chapter 18, Part 6 requires that on-lot septic systems must be pumped at least once every four (4) years. The Township is divided into four (4) septic zones, with **Zone 1 due for pumping in 2024**. To find out what zone you are located in, please visit the Fairview Township website and locate the Septic Zone map.

As a property owner, you are required to:

- Have your system pumped and inspected by a certified pumping hauler.
- Submit the Septic System Report (Manifest Report) to the Township within 30 days of the pumping.

You can view the full on-lot septic ordinance online at www.twp.fairview.pa.us.

Again, if your property is within Zone 4 and your system has been pumped within 4 years, please disregard any correspondence you may receive, as long as the township was copied with your pumping manifest. ****INSPECTIONS DUE BY MARCH 15, 2024****

Post Construction Stormwater Management Best Management Practices (PCSM BMPs) inspections are due to Fairview Township by March 15th. Attn: Homeowners, HOA's and/or Business/Property Owners - If you have a stormwater BMP on your property, you may be responsible for the ongoing inspection and maintenance of that facility. Examples of these include, but are not limited to: Detention/Retention Ponds, Infiltration Ponds, Infiltration Pits, Swales, Infiltration Berms, Stormwater Quality Inlets, and others. These facilities require proper operation and maintenance to ensure they are functioning properly. Inspection forms are available on the MS-4/Stormwater page of the Fairview Township website. These inspection forms are due by March 15th of each calendar year. SCAM ALERT!

As a police department, we continue to see high numbers of incidents involving frauds and scams being reported by our residents. Those whose intent is to defraud you out of your money have become very sophisticated in their methods of getting you to send them money. These scammers and fraudsters can target you either over the phone or electronically on your computer. There are some common warning signs and scams that you can be on the lookout for.

- Somebody who calls you unexpectedly claiming to be from the government and getting you to pay for some fictitious fines or fees.
- A lottery telling you that you have won money and only need to send them the taxes or fees up front to receive your prize.
- A person contacting you and trying to get you to electronically transfer them money or asking you to pay them via gift cards.
- Computer hacking scams whereby you are convinced that your computer is infected with a virus of some kind. They will then fool you into granting them access to your computer and online banking applications.
- Anytime somebody is applying a high degree of pressure to you to get you to pay for something either online or over the phone.
- Calls where you are told a family member is in trouble and needs you to pay money to help them.
- Romance scams. Somebody you do not know tries to establish a personal online relationship with you for the express purpose of getting you to send him or her money.
- Extortion claims where somebody claims to have compromising video or information about you and threatens to release it if you do not pay some amount of money.

We encourage everybody to keep their guard up. View with skepticism anytime somebody you do not know is asking you for or demanding money and take your own steps to verify any requests for money. Anytime somebody makes you feel pressured to make an immediate payment before you can verify his or her claims is a sure sign that you are dealing with a scammer. The elderly can be especially susceptible to scams, so we encourage you to look out for your older family members and friends in an effort to help protect them. RENT-A-KID PROGRAM

Is sponsored by the **York County Area Agency** on Aging, brings older adults and teenagers together.

York County adults 60 years of age or older who need help with



various household chores, including lawn mowing, yard work, snow removal, help with electronic devices and other odd jobs can contact the York County Area Agency on Aging to hire a teenager in their area. The seniors are asked to reimburse the teens a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate based on the job. The teenagers are York County students in grades 7 through 12 or homeschooled. They must complete an application and have it signed by their parent and school guidance counselor. The teens are then entered into a regional database. When the older adults contact the agency, they are matched electronically with teenagers in their area.


