**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FAIRVIEW,

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION FOR THE
JOINT MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR SERVICES FOR
TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES**

WHEREAS, The Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa.C.S.A. §2301 et seq. provides for local governments to cooperate in the exercise or performance of their respective functions, powers or responsibilities and to enter into joint intergovernmental purchasing agreements as may be deemed appropriate for those purposes.

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of Fairview Township deems it in the best interests of Fairview Township to participate in the joint agreement with other York County municipalities for maintenance and repair services for traffic control devices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, and it is hereby resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Fairview Township, York County, Pennsylvania, as follows:



- The organizational structure necessary to implement the Agreement is set forth in the Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement that is attached hereto and made a part hereof.



INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

This Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement for Maintenance and Repair of Traffic Control Devices (the “Agreement”) is made and entered into as of the 27th Day of April, 2026, by and among the several local governments (each, an “Agency” or collectively “Agencies”) which shall join in this Agreement by the execution and delivery of a Joinder Agreement, in the form attached hereto as “Exhibit A”, as the same shall, from time to time, be valid and in effect and not withdrawn or rescinded.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa.C.S.A. §2301 et seq. provides that two or more local governments may jointly cooperate in the exercise or in the performance of their respective governmental functions, powers or responsibilities; and further that local governments so cooperating shall enter into joint agreements as may be deemed appropriate for those purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Agencies have determined that it is in the best interests of the respective Agencies to participate in a joint agreement for maintenance and repair services for the following traffic control devices: traffic signals, school zone flashers, and non-signal flashers (warning devices) (collectively referred to as ("Traffic Control Devices") in order to secure a reliable company at a competitive price to perform these services when there is a malfunction of a Traffic Control Device.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties agree as follows:

1. Recitals. The recitals to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference and shall, for all purposes, be a substantive part of this Agreement.
2. Joinder. Each Agency shall become a party to this Agreement by executing the attached Joinder Agreement marked as Exhibit "A". The executed Joinder Agreements shall be maintained by Windsor Township.
3. Term. The term of this Agreement shall be indefinite, subject to the right of an Agency to withdraw from this Agreement by giving at least thirty (30) days written notice to the participating Agencies.
4. Joint Request for Bids.
 - A. The Agencies agree that joint bidding shall be on a rotating basis with the Agencies determining the order of rotation. Windsor Township agrees to be the initial responsible Agency to conduct the joint bidding.
 - B. Each Agency shall develop a list of Traffic Control Devices and their locations that will require maintenance and repair for submittal to the responsible Agency as part of the bidding process.
 - C. The responsible Agency shall use the bid specifications in the form attached as Exhibit "B".
 - D. Upon receipt of the sealed bids, the responsible Agency shall open the sealed bids and notify the participating Agencies of the results.
 - E. Each participating Agency shall be responsible to enter into its own agreement with the winning contractor in the Municipal Service Agreement for Traffic Control Devices form attached hereto as Exhibit "C," and the participating Agency shall be solely.

responsible for all costs, fees, and expenses under the contract.

5.Amendment. This Agreement may be amended in writing executed by all participating Agencies.

6.Headings. Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the participating Agencies have duly executed this Agreement by executing and delivering the Joinder Agreement.

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
